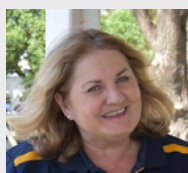

In 1859 Thomas Wills was one of seven members of the Melbourne Cricket Club who devised the rules of the game. In 1896 eight teams, Melbourne, Essendon, Geelong, Fitzroy, Carlton, South Melbourne, St.Kilda and Collingwood formed the Victorian Football League. Richmond joined in 1908. Footscray, Hawthorn and North Melbourne joined in 1925.

In 1990 it became the Australian Football League as interstate teams were admitted.

It has grown into the greatest spectator sport in the world.

The Melbourne Cricket Ground was built in 1853 and is now the premier sporting venue in Australia.

It has housed soldiers in WW2, Olympic Games, Queen's visit, Pope John Paul, Billy Graham and many other events. But, of course, the AFL Grand Final rates there with the best.

Playing in a Grand Final is a magnificent experience – the roar of the crowd and the tension and general atmosphere is never to be forgotten. Even now when I go to the grand final I get quite emotional.

I dreamt of playing AFL as a kid and my father took us from Kyabram to watch. I was very privileged to be able to live that dream.
