Indonesian Students

This program was continued from last year, in which finances for the education of two students was continued. The students are Alwitje Manoy and Nengah Putriasih and are both at The Economic High School in Bali. We have received reports on their progress and letters and Christmas Cards.

Matched Grants

Since 1984, when a matched Club Project was initiated by Graham Bath with the Rotary Club of Salzgetter-Wolffenbuttel in Germany, this Club has regularly kept in contact. This year we had a visit from PP Heinz Tonn and his wife Sigrid, as guests of Eric and Noeline Bare. Heinz also was our quest speaker at a November meeting, and spoke on changes in Germany. Heinz is the initiator of the project with Graham and was presented with a certificate recognizing his contribution over 15 years towards international friendship and goodwill. The Bulletin of International Friendship edited by Heinz continues to be published twice a year, and Ocean Grove often features in same.

Donations In Kind

Our Club again assisted the Donations In Kind program, which was co-ordinated by the Geelong Club. Members were present when the 6th container was loaded and the doors closed before setting off with medical supplies and books for Samoa. Bob Osbourne attended a Geelong Rotary Club meeting where Dr Katrina Watson from St Vincent's Hospital spoke on the great assistance received by Samoa by this project. She had spent a year in Samoa. Thanks to Geoff Chandler and John Dodgshun for help with this project.

Solomon Islands

Josephine Barnes returned to the Club and told us of her progress in teaching in the Solomon Islands following our donation to assist her activities. This has proved to be a worthwhile contribution.

Following is Graham's Report on Rotary Foundation.



Our Rotary weekly meeting included talks from all members of the group, which created great interest. Unfortunately, the visiting team had found the tour tiring and were anxious to return home. The team leader and team members were not cooperating as they should by the time they reached Ocean Grove. Nevertheless the visitors found their time at Ocean Grove most enjoyable and an improvement on some previous weeks. John also chaired the final meeting arranged by the Grovedale Club and attended by the District Governor, as well as returning all members to Melbourne with Henry Hudson in order to catch their plane back to Paris.

Supply of Equipment to Zimbabwe Hospital:

In July 1998, contact was reconfirmed with the Rotary Club of Mutare in Zimbabwe and we received their agreement to assist in controlling the installation of a washing machine to the Murambinda Mission Hospital. A quotation was eventually received for a washing machine, a dryer, a roller ironer and hand irons. With assistance from the District Governor, Ray Welsford and the obtaining of a matched grant it was considered that we could supply all but the roller ironer. For this, a new quotation was required.

This new requirement resulted in further lengthy delays and eventually a new quote was received but much higher in cost. The drama continued, but we were saved by obtaining funds from the District Governor Elect, Bruce Ridland.

The contribution from the club will be \$3000 and the total cost of the project will be \$US8,819. No doubt, this will be one of the largest fundings ever made by this club. We are assured that it is a very worthy cause and the Rotary Club of Mutare will be watching closely over the installation of the equipment.

At the time of writing, the forms have been forwarded to the District Governor and then will be forwarded to Rotary Headquarters in Evanston, USA. So it will be in year 1999/2000 before the project is completed. Many thanks are due to Geoff Morphet, the Chairman of the Matching Grants Committee for expediting this project.

- The committee assisted the President to arrange a successful Senior Citizens Christmas Dinner. This received full support from the club and should become an annual event.
- We also introduced "working meetings" in lieu of some dinner meetings. These allowed some service work to be completed during daylight saving time prior to fellowship and a light meal.



VOCATIONAL SERVICE REPORT

The Vocational Service Committee has enjoyed a productive year and participated in some innovative programs. The development of stronger vocational links with Bellarine Secondary College has been continued this year.

The Vocational Service Program for 1998 – 1999 included:

Operation Livewire

Andrew Fernyhough from Leopold was this club's "Livewire". His operation was to establish a grocery home shopping service. Andrew was a very good participant and received a certificate of commendation for his business plan. A special thanks to John Calnin, Pam Werner and John Webb for assisting as "Livewire" mentors.

Pilot Mentoring Project

A number of Rotarians have expressed interest in Baytecs program to mentor young unemployed people in Geelong. This pilot program will test the effects a mentor relationship has on a young person's job seeking success.

Vocational workplace visit

A successful visit to the Avalon airport complex included a tour of the hanger in which a QANTAS 747 was being refurbished. The function and future development of the facility was outlined to members by Tim Anderson the Business Development Manager.

The development of stronger vocational links and relationships with Bellarine Secondary College.

This priority has been achieved via the following projects:

- ◆ **The Rotary Business Mentoring Register:** A register to assist students at Bellarine Secondary College was formulated to enable local students to access Rotary members' expertise.
- ◆ **The Great Industrial Adventure:** In conjunction with The Rotary Club of Dingley Village, we sponsored two students from Bellarine Secondary College, to spend a week in Melbourne. They were exposed to a range of vocations usually not experienced in a country community, and stayed with members and families of Rotarians. This was the first time our club had undertaken this project and it produced excellent outcomes for the two students, Callan Riley and Melanie Wright.



- The club continued to work with the Lions Club of Queenscliffe in the annual decoration of the Christmas Tree at Point Lonsdale.
- The club again supported Barwon Coast in removal of weeds and rubbish from the foreshore. A recommendation that the club should "adopt" a section of the foreshore for vegetation management will be made to the club.

OTHER PROJECTS

- Other projects have included financial support for a local kindergarten, assistance to people in need and Red Cross calling.
- The committee also supported Laverton Rotary's Annual Cardiac Camp for children with heart problems when they visited the area. This was a worthwhile involvement.

DINNER PROGRAM

- Councillor Rob Binnie addressed the club on community service programs in the club's area with an emphasis on projects which the club could become involved. Since that meeting the Council has funded some temporary skating facilities at Shell Road.

CONCLUSION

I was disappointed that we were unable to achieve a balanced program throughout the year due to lack of opportunities and some mishaps. Using that experience we will aim to be more effective in 1999/2000.

My thanks to committee members Hans, Norm, Geurt, Alan (Joyce), Tim, Bill, David, Jeff (Bentley) and Geoff (Ford).

MARKET REPORT

We had a very good year. Gross revenue topped \$10,000 (\$8,463 last year) and that was on the basis of seven markets compared with eight. Market costs were about \$2000, thus a profit of more than \$8,000. During the year, we increased the market site capacity from 70 to 100, which is just as well because we had 114 applications for Easter Monday and the average for the entire season was 74 compared with 56 in the previous year.

Our very efficient team of car parkers squeezed 1,200 vehicles (not including store-holders vehicles) into the park on 3rd January and 1,100 for the Easter Market. The average visitors vehicles for the entire season was 854. Incidentally, if John Dodgshun's estimate of 4 bodies per vehicle is anywhere near accurate, we had about 24,000 visitors to our 7 markets last season.

Undoubtedly, the great success of this market is due in no small part to the efficiency and enthusiasm of the club members. Sixteen members are involved each month and I must pay special tribute to Mark Donehue who prints all the monthly leaflets and promotional material plus the newsletters to stallholders and somehow, manages to get all of the stallholders on site with great efficiency and good humour. He produced a total of 10,000 leaflets, posters and newsletters throughout the seven months of the season.

I would also like to pay special tribute to Eric Bare and Rod Birrell who quietly and efficiently distribute our signage around the wider community before each market. We plan to upgrade all of those signs prior to the commencement of the 1999/2000 season.

With an extra market in the coming year and very strong advance support from stallholders (we now have 130 on our books) together with our plans for some form of monthly entertainment on the park area, we look forward to another successful season. The gross proceeds last year included almost \$1,700 in sales of raffle tickets for the contents of the wheelbarrow very generously donated by John Webb at Wallington Mitre 10.

The market has become a very time consuming activity and I extend sincere thanks to Jan who took the majority of about 300 telephone calls during the season.

We also supported several other organisations with free sites, not the least of which was the Ocean Grove Fire Brigade which did very well with their monthly barbecue.
