Rod Bush, Secretary: We have been contacted by Greg Muldoon from the Rotary Club of Sydney. His family in Ocean Grove have a four year old daughter with multiple allergies. She is being treated through an organisation in the USA which only has a clinic in Sydney. Part of the process involves taking a larger dose of a possible allergen once a fortnight but must be done in the presence of someone, nurse or doctor, who has medical training. Currently, they have to go to Sydney each fortnight. Do we know of any medically trained people who could be present at these dosage sessions. Guest Speaker: Alicia Kennedy, Cherished Pets Foundation

Alicia said that her father was involved with Rotary. Cherished Pets is based in Madeley Street, Ocean Grove but has a regional reach. Alicia is a vet who became interested in the human - animal bond. This is very powerful and can transform both physical and mental human life. It becomes more important as humans age but age affects their capacity to keep their animals healthy and well. Cherished Pets began with asking what we need to do to help elderly people but has

evolved into other areas. It now involves a private vet practice in Madeley Street, an end of (pet) life service which supports people and pets through this final stage and a veterinary social work service providing home pet care assistance, crisis care, etc. The purpose of Cherished Pets Foundation is to enable the human-animal bond focusing on the elderly, disabled people, those facing a mental health crisis, those fleeing domestic violence and the homeless. Pets are the main focus of some people's life.

The Cherished Pets Foundation is a registered charity. It runs a volunteer program, fundraising, a social service and subsidises costs. The social service, Home Pet Care Assistance, is housed in a separate building in Madeley Street. It offers a community vet nurse, pet transfers, emergency care plans, volunteer assistance, dog walking and community connection or companionship among participants and volunteers. The crisis service works with other organisations when dealing with clients with pets. It provides support to people affected by domestic violence, hospitalisation, mental health crises, homelessness and access to veterinarians. The volunteer program offers home assistance, pet minding, transport and transfers, fundraising and marketing. All the Board are volunteers. There is also community engagement at the Pet Hub in Madeley Street among groups of people involved in the care of elderly pets and their owners. They make snuffle pads as a fundraiser. Public events have been reduced due to COVID but they are now trying to get more going.



John Paton thanked Alicia on behalf of the Club. He said it is a locally based charity but one of a kind globally. There is a lot of international interest in this kind of veterinary social work. If people would like to volunteer with Cherished Pets see Alicia. John suggested the Club might help through funding a marquee for their fundraising. Gil Morgan said she has one which might be suitable.

President's Report: Lynne Carlson

Foundation group held the first information meeting for new members tonight before the general meeting. Other meetings will be held on the first Tuesday of each month. In September, Noel Emselle will run one on the Environment Committee and others will be held through to December.

The Club has been asked to put forward members to go on District Committees. Paul Brewster will go on the Youth Committee. Several members are being considered for the Family Violence Awareness Committee to be followed up.




