Reports

Presentations to Recipients of the Bellarine Secondary College VCE Awards for 2020 and 2021.

The money is held in trust by the school to assist with costs for textbooks, excursions, extra studies and other fees during these years. She was house captain during the year which helped her develop her public speaking skills. Next year she intends to take a gap year and visit Japan where she wants to investigate their film industry. She saved the money for the trip by working at Rivers in Geelong. After that, she intends to go to RMIT or

Victoria University to study media and is looking to a career making movies. She was accompanied by her mother, Karen Giles.

Meredith reported that **Jeavyn Bullock** and his mother Danielle had been unable to attend tonight as his father had just had major surgery following an accident and they were at the hospital. He apologised for not attending due to this family emergency but would send a message for the next meeting.
