They have an Outreach van which operates on the Bellarine and aims to provide support to those who are lonely, hungry and troubled. These people are treated with dignity and



given on-going support. This van needs an upgrade. They have a Friday night Youth Group in Clifton Springs which has about 50 young people attending each Friday. They find that NEED is across all socio-economic boundaries and people who thought they would never be in trouble sometimes need help. They are often embarrassed to seek help. The Salvos are passionate about all people.
