Marion was born in Ballarat in the 1950s. Her father had a grocer's shop and started Ballarat's first supermarket. She was very active in sport, particularly tennis and golf. After school, she intended to do mothercraft nursing but got a job at Myers and loved it so much she stayed.



Bill was born in 1949 at Wurrook and grew up on the farm. Marion and Bill married in 1972 and moved to the farm at Wurrook South near Rokewood. They have two children, Adam born in 1974 and Sarah born in 1975. Together they made huge improvements to the farm. The farm was 5,000 acres and they ran 20,000 sheep. They planted thousands of trees on the property which turned it into a wonderful environment. It is part of the Landcare catchment. They were helped in the planting by the prisoners from Langi Kal Kal prison, the Rover Scouts and the football club. Pigs were introduced to the farm and Adam now has 30 large sheds with


