Shayda is a 2023 Australian drama film written, directed, and coproduced by Noora Niasari. Inspired by Niasari's childhood experiences, the story follows an Iranian immigrant woman in Australia who is raising her young daughter as the two live in a women's shelter, while also attempting to divorce her abusive husband.

This captivating film is the official submission in Australia for the 'Best International Feature Film' category of the 96th Academy Awards and had its world premiere at the Sundance Film Festival in January 2023 where it won the audience award and the grand jury prize. She took those members present through an Individual Member Survey to assist in forming club response to various questions about activities which were considered important in the work of Rotary at Ocean Grove.

Family of Rotary: Judy Greer; Rod Bush's condition was explained.

Adrian Schmidt has had some stents replaced and is progressing slowly.

Guest Speaker: Lindy Freestone.

Lindy is President of the Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club. She has been involved with the Club for many years and has been involved in all aspects of club activities. In her 'free time' she works in child and adolescent mental health.

The Club is active 365 days per year with members giving 6000 hours of voluntary work on patrol with more behind the scenes.

Emergencies and drowning incidents have increased over recent years especially in younger children, and during Covid when the ability to access the beach was very popular and precious. Numbers attending the beach grew to approximately 118,945 during 2022.

Lindy spoke about her aims and values for OGSLSC and demonstrated that they are based on sound, fundamental principles, and beliefs.

She also explained the six pillars of club:

- Emergency Service including flood response in the state and elsewhere, beach surveillance and action, and general emergency response.
- Life Saving Program which includes the Nippers. The Nippers Program has closed at 300 as it is full.
- Training and education of all members. There are over 300 courses conducted and supported for members.
- Surf Sport. The club has been State Champions for the last 7 years.
- Leadership Development and Community Service.
- Community/ Social Care including preventative mental health and member wellbeing.

Girls and boys compete and train together and there are multiple pathways for people to investigates and pursue. Many lifelong friendships have developed.

Lindy believes that by encouraging members to do community service team spirit is developed as well as a sense of belonging. This philosophy appears to be working as membership has grown to over 2000.

Fiscal accountability and business development is also very important, especially as there is no recurrent funding for the Club. Finance is provided through grant applications, donations and fundraising. Expenses continue to increase as do repair and maintenance of equipment.

Lindy's goal for the future is to set the club up for the future in structure, resourcing and direction including environmental protection. Community education and safety are also included.

She firmly believes that the club is more than the red and yellow on the beach with a high public profile for the holiday season. She demonstrated it is a 365 day club with many facets and irons in the fire.
