She grew up in the western district of Victoria and heard stories about the Indigenous people who had lived in the area. She discovered that many of the names used in that community were derived from Indigenous culture and that their local history was very different from that been taught in schools at that time.

Today's schools operate in consultation with local indigenous people. Fay has helped train teachers in learning the principles, practice and content of social justice. This has helped Indigenous children to learn about their culture and their roles within that culture. Subject content related to creativity, culture and community is taught within schools. The aim is to create a safe place where all families can feel included and accepted. It provides all students with an understanding of our common heritage and history and its importance to everyday life is emphasised. Sometimes it is difficult to be correct and satisfying to all concerned. However, sharing, celebrating, learning and connecting to each other and to country is woven throughout lessons, programs and activities rather than being taught as a seperate subject. It is very important to learn the nuances of each area where people are living and respect and understand the activities and customs of that area and to acknowledge them. Research into these local customs is important. The current tense should be used and there needs to be ongoing reinforcement of this knowledge. Custodianship of the land is more important than ownership of the land and is the responsibility of all residents in an area.

\$6,000 has been donated to the Art School in the Industrial Estate to build a protective fence. This had been promised last year.


