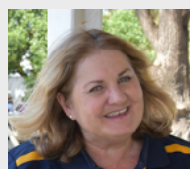

John's father's first café was in Lonsdale Street Melbourne. Most of his relatives had cafes, fruit shops or fruit stalls at Vic Market. They worked extremely hard with all family members pitching in to help each other. John rejected the Greek culture in his teens but renewed his interest as he grew older and joined the Kastellorizian Association in the early 2000's.

John has 2 sons – Simon and David who are both married and has 1 granddaughter.

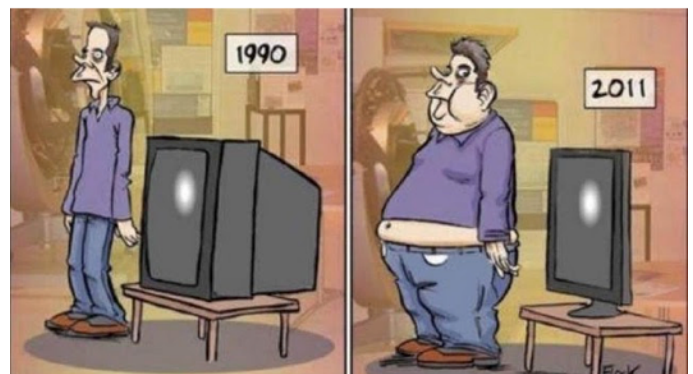
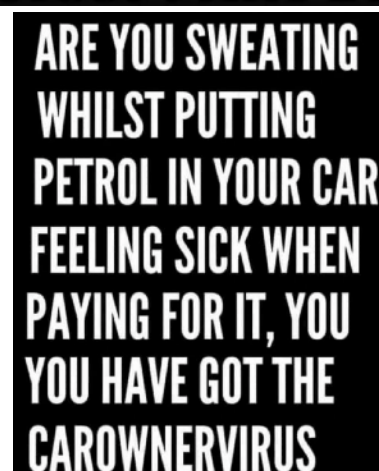
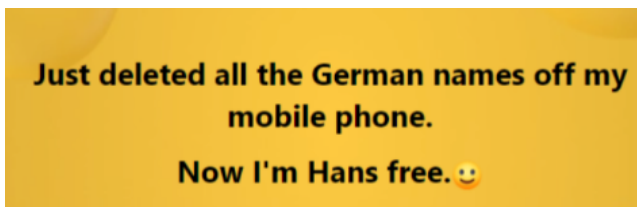

John retired in 2020. While John was at Mayne Nickless he was encouraged to undertake further studies and obtained a Bachelor of Business degree by studying after business hours.

He played a very good standard of football including with Robert Walls and Barry Armstrong who both went on to play for Carlton.
