President's Report 2015-2016

This year we introduced a few changes.

- Firstly trialing a different meeting format for the first meeting of each month. The meeting is held first, finishing at 7.30, then a meal for those who want to stay. Eaters are given a menu choice of 5 different meals. After several meetings it was decided at a club assembly to continue with this as a regular change.
- Secondly we introduced the concept of a Business Membership, with 1 member and up to 3 associates who could fill in for the “member” when they could not be at a meeting. Associates pay only \$20 per annum and only the member has voting rights.

Highlights –roughly chronologically

- Judy Greer our President Elect attended the 3 day Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) during the year, and we have two members signed to do it next year.
- Rob Rushford was accepted into the club as a new member
- Our first social event organized by the social committee led by John Calnin was a Wine and Cheese tasting/ Christmas in July (early August), which was a great success.
- John Paton again started work on ride the Bellarine and it was again run successfully in April with the total amount raised over the two years (with matching grants) being enough to administer 200,000 doses for the prevention of Polio. A great effort John.
- In August Judy Greer and I put together a Strategic Plan for the club, which we modified slightly early this year. It was presented and approved by the club members at a club assembly this year.
- Tree planting up at the OG Lookout was carried out in the spring and the club planted about 250 trees.
- Three garden beds at the Surfside Primary School were extended over 3 working bees, and Surfside won 1st place in the Primary school Garden Comp, and 2nd place in the Kevin Heinz Garden Competition. OG RC has been instrumental in helping them with their garden over the years, from the very start about 10 years ago. Peter Cullen from Community Service has been instrumental in organizing our working bees over the past few years.
- We have committed to help other clubs in the district to introduce RYDA (Rotary Youth Driver Awareness) into the schools in our area beginning next Rotary year and being driven by the RC of Queenscliff.
- One day winery Sunday luncheon organized by the social committee, and many members and partners attended a good fun afternoon.
- Location of our fountain was decided by chair John Wynn and the Community Committee, and it is to go in the grounds of the Uniting Church. Costs at this stage are higher than budgeted for so further quotes/actions will need to be considered.
- John Paton ably ran the Summer Market until December when Graeme and Sandy Chamberlain took over. Thanks to you all.
- The Art Show was a great success with over \$9000 in profits being distributed throughout the community with Riding Develops Abilities and the Disabled Surfers being the main benefactors.
Congratulations to John Calnin and the art show committee.
- The Rotary Junior Community Awards (RJCA) instigated by chair Geoff Chandler and other members of the Youth Committee, was again carried out by the 3 Primary Schools in OG, and we had 4 members from each school attend a meeting and present their work. It’s a program which is great for the kids and opens the parents up to a little of what Rotary is all about

- The Christmas dinner catered for more than 80 senior citizens and thanks to Marion Walton and Gil Morgan and team for coordinating the organization of the night.
- Our Christmas breakup was a Hollywood night theme again organized by John Calnin was great fun. We had two Paul Harris Fellow presentations on the night, Nan Calnin and Elaine Elliot.
- Sydney Coad was our outbound student for Youth Exchange. She left in January this year and she is spending her 12 months in Japan.
- Geoff Ford again expertly ran our Car raffle sales, and in early Jan we again sold tickets to the caravan parks, followed by a sumptuous dinner cooked by "Coog" and again enjoyed in the beautiful surrounds of Gordon and Marion King's home.
- Also Sami Gravenor returned from her year in France as an exchange student sponsored by our club, and she was guest speaker at the club in April where she told us about her experiences about life as an exchange student.
- Gerry Spencer was presented with his Paul Harris Wings.
- Due to some inspiration and a lot of hard work from Dick Clay and Eng Ho and the social committee, we celebrated Chinese New Year in Feb, and invited some of the Chinese business community to the evening, which was a resounding success.
- John Paton received a Paul Harris Fellow award
- Peter Hawthorn ran Red Cross Calling again, and *again* we raised over \$10,000 for Red Cross, which is additional to our fundraising mentioned above.
- Vocational, led by Martin Geerings in the extended absence of Geoff Brentnall, made 3 pride of workmanship awards, and also organized a tour of the Boorai Centre and the new Geelong Library, both of which were enjoyed very much by the members
- We awarded a \$1,000 scholarship for a second year Culinary Student at The Gordon to Guiliana Anlas, who is a resident of OG.
- Dick Clay took over the responsibility of providing the BBQ breakfast for the Anzac dawn service.
- 3 new members were inducted into the club, Tibor Janos, Pearl Macmillan, and Lynne Carlson, Lynne joining as a Business Member bringing along 3 associates with her.
- Jacqui Honeywell was our selected student for Rotary Exchange to go OS next January provided she passes all the screening tests run by the district Youth Exchange Committee. (Late note- she will be going to Germany)
- The Youth committee decided to take in an exchange student sharing with Drysdale RC and we are expecting Tiffany Shih from Taiwan in July. Ann Hodgkinson is going to be primary councillor for Tiffany with Coral Barker being her backup.
- Over the year Wal Kelly looked after the maintenance of the several defibrillators around OG and also ran several sessions for different organizations on how to use them.
- Over the year the Dry Cell Battery Recycling programme collected several tonnes of dry cell batteries, which would normally go to the tip. Peter Cullen took responsibility for their delivery into Geelong.
- Marg. Campbell led the programme group arranging a great list of guest speakers.
- Alison George with some help from Ann Hodgkinson put together the bulletin together for the year.
- Vic Harnath ran the bowel scan screening for the club
- Two new district grants for our Solmaid School were applied for by the International committee led by Dick Clay, and I am very pleased that we were awarded one of these, which will be worth \$6000 to provide shoes and books for the children attending the school. District contribution will be half.

I want to thank Tony Haines our secretary for a great job in keeping me “in line” and “on track”. We all know there is more work in being secretary than being President, and Tony has excelled in his job. Thanks Tony.

Also thanks to Noel Emselle our Treasurer, who spent many many hours firstly getting the books to balance, and then moving the whole accounting system onto Quick Books. Thanks Noel for your commitment to the job, and I know your job will be easier for all the work this year.

Then to PP John Paton who was always there in the background, quietly doing many things that needed doing, without many people realizing, and also giving me great support.

And of course my thanks to Vice President Coral Barker, whom I dropped into the chair due to my absences, especially over the Anzac day period where she ran three meetings, one board meeting, laid 2 wreaths and inducted 3 new members, all in the period of 16 days. Thanks Coral.

Also to the Services chairs who designed our programs, and the board whose wisdom in consideration of the many programs and ideas put forward made my job easier.

Thanks to the Walton's for organizing the weekly raffle, which raises quite a significant amount for the club, to the sergeants, Greer, Birrell, Franken and Barker who did their best to extract money out of our pockets and provided us with lots of fun and laughter.

Foundation Report – 2015-2016

During 2015-16 Ocean Grove Rotary continued its strong support of The Rotary Foundation.

The Club has thirty-two Paul Harris Fellows, eight of whom have one or more Sapphire pins.

The Club also has two members of the Paul Harris Society (who have committed to donating \$US1,000.00 per annum to The Rotary Foundation).

Ocean Grove Rotary played a lead role in the running the "Ride the Bellarine". This was a major fund-raiser for Polio Plus, and raised a total of \$23,000 from sponsorship and the 320 cyclists. This amount was also matched 2 for 1 by the Bell and Melinda Gates Foundation. Twenty members of the Club participated in the running of the event, and raised \$1,050.

During the past year seventeen members of the Club have contributed to the Centurion programme, contributing a further \$1,800 to The Rotary Foundation.

This has been built on this year, with further updates to the documents being made as well as the preparation and printing of two new documents: "Rotary Membership - The Basics" and a new *Rotary Membership brochure*. All these documents go towards making understanding the commitments and benefits involved in becoming a member of our club much clearer, and are supported by an excellent mentoring process established in 2014/5.

Club President Adrian Schmidt and immediate Past President John Paton did preparatory work in exploring the possibilities surrounding corporate membership opportunities and these bore fruit with our first Business Member being inducted in April. Lynne Carlson is a new member representing the 'helloworld' Travel agency in Waurn Ponds. Lynne's associated business members are *David Carlson, Nicole Rappel* and *Rhys Rappel*. Other new members welcome to the club were, Rob Rushford, Tibor Janos (and his wife Felicity Rousseaux) and Pearl Macmillan. We look forward to their contribution to the activities of Rotary and trust they will get a great deal of enjoyment and satisfaction from the many aspects of a Rotary membership.

Gillian Morgan has forwarded a précied version of our Bulletins to keep those on the email list of FROG's (Friends of Ocean Grove Rotary) members up to date with club activities, but

the decision has been made that in the coming year, we will send a normal bulletin, to provide a more comprehensive coverage of our activities.

We created a new group title for “Rotary Supporters” to recognise those able to provide support at individual events/activities, while not being in the position to become full members. They will be provided with a special Rotary Supporters cap in recognition of their contributions.

In the coming year we will be trialing a series of theme nights which will showcase local enterprises and invite community members to attend presentations detailing their activities. The intention is to expose community members to not only these new enterprises, but also to the activities of our club, with the possibility of attracting potential new members.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Club applied for a grant that the District made available for public relations purposes up to the value of \$2,000. This grant was so popular that each participating Club in D9780 was only allocated \$850. However, for Ocean Grove, this enabled new pamphlets and bookmarks promoting membership to be designed and printed. Bookmarks tend to be kept by people as “something useful” so it is hoped some interest in membership might be garnered from these.

The Board also approved new caps for Friends of Rotary and the cost of these was covered partly by the grant.

In an effort to improve market bookings, advertisements were placed for a 12-month period in “Markets and Fairs”.

Facebook has been used extensively to promote the market and the Club in general. The number of people viewing the Club’s Facebook page has risen considerably in the last 12 months.

Editorials in local papers have decreased as these publications seek revenue from advertising and the space allocated to the likes of Rotary, Lions, etc. seems to have shrunk.

Community Service is also financially responsible for a variety of projects that are organized by non-committee members – Senior Citizens Christmas Dinner, Anzac Day breakfast,

The International Committee has had another productive, varied, emotional and pleasing year.

We have continued our humanitarian and member friendly project at the "Solmaid Special School" in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

This Project includes the funding of a Lunch for the students at the School for every day of the Scholastic year, Jan. to Dec.

We look forward to continuing this most popular International Project.

The Resident Chef Jason Small, including a large delicious Barramundi and many other Chinese delights at each table, put on a magnificent Chinese spread. Many thanks go to Eng Ho for his supply and assistance with the decorations for the night, as well as his presentation of his early days growing up as a Chinese in Malaysia. As usual his address was both informative and humorous.

Many of those present joined in with the Chinese theme of the night and dressed accordingly. Our Chinese invited guessed were thrilled to be asked to attend and thoroughly enjoyed the evening.

The Committee also aided with the décor set up and dismantling and there assistance was greatly appreciated.
