Janet Alexander, Footy Tipping: Gary O'Donnell is still in the lead. This week Janet Alexander and Jenny Wright had five winners. Janet won on the margin.

Marion Walton: Advised that 340 bowel cancer kits had been distributed with 170 returned.

Judy Greer, Family of Rotary: A card had been sent to Tony and David Fox offering sympathy on the passing of their mother, Jan Fox. Judith McDonald, wife of past Rotarian John McDonald died. John was a past president of the Club 1986-87.

Guest Speaker: Jan Johannsen, Bali Smiles.

Jan went to Bali in 1980 and was moved by the presence of street kids selling postcards and necklaces who were at risk of abuse. Many came from Munti Gunung, a very poverty-stricken area in the north-east of the Island. It is a very traditional village with primitive housing and no sanitation. Very few crops grow there. The street kids are tied spiritually to their village and while working in Kuta cannot attend school. They often have health issues due to the lack of hygiene. She befriended one boy, Madi Budiasa. The families rely on having a son to look after them as only people with Government jobs get any support.

There were no health services in the area. Jan raised some money to get a bus to take people from the village for eye treatment and surgery on cataracts. She was able to obtain a plot of land near the village and fund raised to build a Health Clinic and obtain equipment. The equipment was transported by an old truck on rutted roads and



then had to be carried two kilometres into the village. It opened in October 2013 with 46 patients. They hired a midwife and built a concrete strip to allow access for motorcycles to transport patients. However, some of the money raised was lost through corruption. Eventually, they hired a doctor, Dr. Momang, at \$200 a month. Services have been disrupted by COVID.

She was able to get Madi to school, and he has married and set up a car transport business. So far, twenty-six children have been sponsored to get an education. In 2014, she set up 'Feed a Family' sponsorship to give poor families bags of rice and in some cases a pig. Raising pigs is one of the few options they have available to earn money. She is now attempting to find a way of getting water to the village. However, many of these programs have been disrupted by the current COVID outbreak.

Jan raises money through raffles, school sponsorships, markets, selling greeting cards and donations from op shops. Some of the programs have dedicated sponsorship.
