Guest Speaker:

ADG Vicci Funnell.

Vicci took the role as Assistant District Governor for Group 9 at short notice when Di Crawford retired to care for her husband John. She joined Rotary in 2003. A quiz about Rotary commenced the proceedings. The questions were answered by a few but the amount of silence at the time was obvious!



Vicci earned a BSC (Hons) from the UK and worked at the Austin Hospital on her return. She gained a scholarship to undertake her master's degree in Health Administration at the University of NSW and subsequently worked in the scientific management field in many areas including the Epilepsy Foundation, Scope Victoria, Southern Health, Make-A-Wish Foundation and more recently Operation Cleft. This organization is committed to improving the lives of the many children who have cleft lip in Bangladesh.

She gained a scholarship to study at Harvard University Business School in the USA where she thoroughly enjoyed the experience of the positivity of American students and learned the effect assertive behavior had on her learning. She concentrated on Strategic perspectives in Non-Profit management. Vicci is currently working in a voluntary capacity and in 2002 was awarded a Centenary Medal for her services to the community.

Vicci emphasized the areas of focus and seven areas of action as well as the four-way test that Rotary Clubs and members are expected to follow. The role of the Assistant District Governor was explained. Vicci believes it is a resource to be used to represent and support administration, knowledge and management skills of Clubs as well as promoting and facilitating communication between clubs. She recommended the use of the District website to assist this.

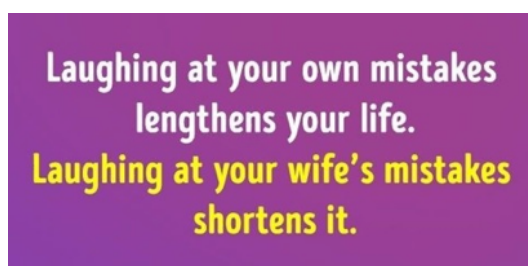
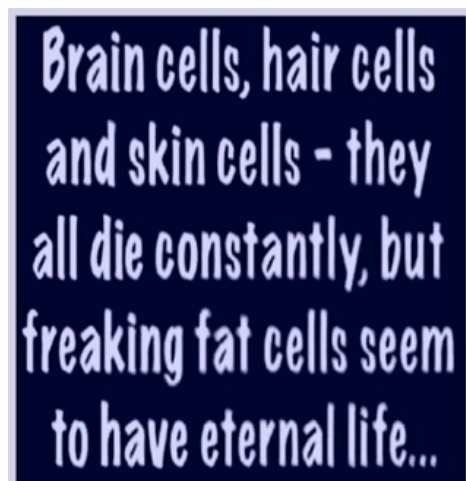
There are ten ADGs in District 9780 who are hoping to organize social events so members can learn to know each other better so they can work together for new projects. One of the aims of the ADGs is to revive Rotoract activities by encouraging past RYLAH, RYPEN and Rotary Exchange students to become involved. This may be promoted by club publicity generally, through discussion with Business Associations and perhaps support of scholarship at Deakin University.

Ageing membership and the associated results of this was mentioned as well as the benefits of meeting with other clubs where a large single project might be conceived. A merger with other clubs may be a necessity and should be considered in the future. Vicci and her husband have been working a vineyard 'Hatrock' for 25 years, perhaps assisted by their two children.

The talk was finished with the quote 'Make a living by what you get, make a life by what you give.' This may be the adage held and demonstrated by most of the membership of RI Ocean Grove.

- Most members of our **Oral History Interview team** met briefly to celebrate the achievement of the reaching their 18th interview ! Look for an article in the local press very soon. !

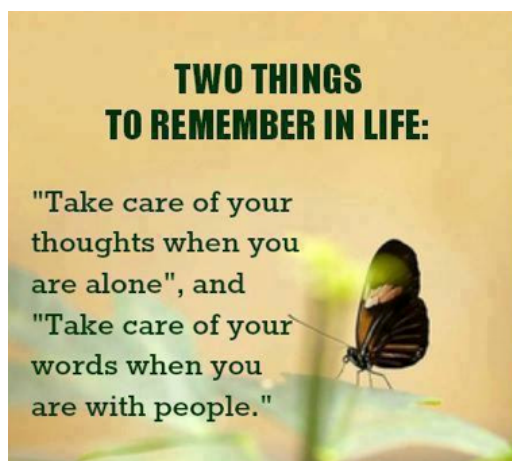
