Foundation Report



District Grants

In 2019 Ocean Grove was successful in obtaining a District Grant for the amount of \$3,000, to be matched by an equivalent amount from the Club. The purpose of this Grant was to reinstate a community sculpture that had originally been installed by the Club at the Surfside Centre in 1991-2.

At the time that the Club applied for the Grant there was an understanding with the City of Greater Geelong that the sculpture would be installed at the Lookout Reserve. Subsequent budget constraints and bureaucracy meant that the preferred location was no longer available.

Discussions were then held with Barwon Coast and the Ocean Grove Surf Club with a view to identifying another suitable site. These discussions have continued, but final approval was not received in time to enable the Club to complete the works by the time stipulated by the Grant.

The Club then sought approval from District to repurpose part of the Grant for a Covid-19 project, and a local community food project, "Feed Me Bellarine", was selected. The balance of the Grant was surrendered to District.

Donations to The Rotary Foundation

The impact of the Covid-19 restrictions has had a major impact on the Club's income, and the ability of members to contribute to The Rotary Foundation.

Nonetheless, the Club has contributed an amount of \$2,301.65, of which \$1,000 was designated for Polio Plus. The Club has also contributed to The Rotary Foundation a further \$US2,000 (\$A3,480) and nominated two Paul Harris Fellows (PHF).

Individual Rotarians have continued their generosity to The Rotary Foundation through the Centurion programme, PHF recognition, and The Paul Harris Society. In recognition of these ongoing donations the Club currently has more than forty PHF's, numerous multiple sapphire and ruby pin recognitions, and one major donor, and three Paul Harris Society members.

The Rotary Foundation appreciates the on-going support of club members.

Public Image Report



Before the COVID-19 lockdown in March we were able to obtain a reasonable amount of exposure for Rotary through annual events such as the Art Show, Summer Markets and the Vocational Community Awards. Social Media has become a very cost effective way of getting our message across about where and when these events are taking place.

We also reached out to the local community to ask them what it was they wanted Rotary to work toward in the local community, unfortunately the response was disappointing. The local press and in particular 'The Voice' newspaper has been particularly supportive in helping us build our public image however there is still more to do.

'People of Action' is the name of Rotary's latest worldwide public image campaign, it is designed to bring the Rotary story to life for those who don't know us. Community Service Report



Lookout Reserve

Regular surveillance by Rotarians continues picking up the odd trash missed by the council officers who keep the park in particularly good condition. Recent plantings have had a good success level.

Scheduled play equipment replacement by CoGG took place in the second half of the year completed just prior to corona virus closure of park equipment. At short notice, a crew of Rotarian volunteers with the help of Wynnndean's bobcat, removed the timber surround and the soft-fall mulch from the play equipment and redistributed it under the mature vegetation.

The Perry Mills "Concept Master Plan" plan has been endorsed by CoGG parks and open space officers on condition that each significant project we undertake will need to be documented in detail and reviewed by council officers.

Currently the reserve within the roadway is classed as a "neighbourhood park". So, regulations state that it does not warrant shade structures, BBQs, toilets etc. We hope to get the council to recognise the tourism value of the rest of the land south of the roadway and classify it as a "regional park", thereby justifying a lookout platform, shade structures, and BBQs, toilets etc.

Erosion of the clay cliff below the Barwon Water surge tower (a potential lookout platform site) is of concern and we will continue to lobby council and Barwon Coast to address the issues before we can be confident that a structure will not make the situation worse.

Ocean Grove Nature Reserve

We have commissioned two new picnic tables on galvanised steel frames manufactured by Rod Birrell. With the help of the OG Men's Shed small plaques were fitted to recognise our donation.

BASC Sculpture Repositioning

After several years of negotiations with council officers, and intervention by Lisa Neville MP, Barwon Coast has agreed we may install it on the foreshore at the Surf Beach Access 14W. This site will benefit from some hands-on landscaping and continuing surveillance as we do for the Lookout Reserve.

Designing and costing is now underway, and Isobel Paton has come on board to handle the landscaping issues. If grant money becomes available we should see this project completed in Rotary year 2020-21.

Shell Rd Pavilion Flag Poles.

Three poles were donated in response to community suggestions but are yet to be installed at Shell Road sports complex. We will install plaques when size and placement is determined.

Barwon Bluff Boardwalk

It has been noted that the Rotary emblems placed on the boardwalk in 2005 have been vandalised or suffering weather degradation. Plans to re-identify our club's involvement are progressing.

Grubb Road Trail

We have had meetings over the years with VicRoads and CoGG re the maintenance of the Rotary-signed nature track from Thacker St to the OGNR main entry which continues to deteriorate. No progress has been made.

Other Community Service Related Activities

- Two collections for the district Donations in Kind project,
- The club, through Marion Walton's group, again staged the Seniors Christmas Dinner at the Bowls Club.
- Members manned the gates of the GDFL football finals on 6 days and were rewarded with a donation of \$5,000. Thanks to Rtn. Peter Cullen.

Rotary Programs

RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program for Enrichment): District 9780 activity for 14-16 year old students. This program did not operate in 2020.

RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award): District 9780 program for 18-25 year old young adults. This program was promoted through the community noticeboard on Facebook but there were no expressions of interest. The program was cancelled in 2020.

District International Youth Exchange .

Ocean Grove Rotary Club is currently not participating in this program.

Science Programs Supported by Rotary

National Youth Science Forum - this annual two week program is held in Canberra in January for students who are about to commence year 12 studies. Information was forwarded to schools through the Science Teachers Association but there were no applicants for Rotary support last year We will promote this program to local schools and plan to provide a subsidy of \$190 per student if they are successful in selection for the September 2020 program.
