Guest Speakers: Volunteers from Queenscliff Coast Guard



Between 1956 and 1976 a rescue lifeguard service ran at Queenscliff until it was closed due to the age of their boat. In 1976 Coast Guard Queenscliff was established. It is a volunteer emergency service which works under the water police. The Coast Guard consists of 18 local flotillas with 900 members in Victoria. In emergencies, call 000 and the water police will dispatch the nearest service. There are also services in Ocean Grove, Torquay and on the Nepean Peninsula. They are also a CFA brigade which responds to emergency fires on boats or other water incidents. Fibreglass boats burn quickly.

They are engaged in community education involving public education, market stalls, newsletters and facebook and public presentations. Members have qualifications as coxswains, general purpose hands and support service team skills. They undergo extensive training. They also provide marine search and rescue. The main problem boaters experience are mechanical failures together with running out of fuel, running aground and flat batteries. Inn 2020 they went to 72 jobs. In 2021 this rose to 90 jobs with most of the increase from mechanical failures due to poor preparation by boaters before going out.

In 2020/2021, they provided 27 hours of operations at \$50 per hour or a cost of \$50,000. Sixty-six percent of these costs were covered by the State Government and the rest from sponsorship, fund raising and donations, particularly from the Lions Club. New capital projects were solar panels for their Headquarters, new shed and fencing, a

navigation system, video conferencing facilities, and a marine rescue mannequin. They are now seeking to fund two spotlights for night searching and a Dolphin Remote Control Drone.

Guitars for Vets: Graham O'Donnell submitted this report from Deakin.

Guitars for Veterans Australia (G4VA) is a great new initiative that is helping Australian Veterans experiencing Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) express themselves through the healing power of music. Dave Cox, founding member of G4VA, presented to Rotary Club Ocean Grove earlier in the year. As a result, Graham O'Donnell facilitated



for G4VA to partner with Deakin University's FreelancingHUB on a student-led project, which commenced in early July. The FreelancingHUB falls under Deakin University's Graduate Employment Division and is part of DeakinTALENT. The FreelancingHUB partners with non-profit and government agencies to work together on impactful multidisciplinary projects. The projects are student-run and managed by an experienced project manager.

G4VA provides veterans with a free guitar and a formal lesson plan as an opportunity to learn a new skill and a find a creative outlet or even a new direction. Following the mantra 'where words fail, music speaks', G4V is bringing the healing power of music and self-expression to help veterans who are struggling with their mental health.

G4VA is a not-for-profit ACNC charity grassroots team of volunteers that accept donated guitars from the community and provides them to willing veterans, along with a formal ten-lesson plan to help learn how to play the instrument. This amazing organisation has already helped over 100 veterans by providing 100+ guitars and 1000+ lessons. G4VA is currently seeking industry sponsorship support to continue the supply of guitars and lesson funding.

The Freelancing HUB is assisting G4VA to deliver the following outcomes by early October:

- •research and provide a strong evidence base to support the healing power of music in treating mental health conditions such as PTSD in veterans
- •create a sponsorship plan and accompanying sponsorship pack (to be sent out to potential sponsors)
- •create a communications strategy and social media plan to increase awareness of G4VA to the general public, veterans that are in need of assistance, and potential industry sponsors

The team is just over 4 weeks into this project and are progressing well on the agreed scope of works.

G4VA recently produced a promotional CD *Where Words Fail* – The FreelancingHUB team has recently purchased and we can say first-hand that this is a fantastic album of uplifting and soulful music. Each CD purchased at \$30 will fund a guitar lesson for a Vet.
