Guest Speaker: MICHAEL DILLON AM ACS FRGS

Michael is both a Documentary Film Producer and a Documentary cinematographer. As cinematographer he has shot more than a hundred documentaries worldwide from adventure documentaries to wildlife documentaries and the occasional mainstream project such as the US reality TV show Survivor.

Michael's interest in filmmaking was aroused when he was a schoolboy and he soon had a camera to record his interests. The early cameras and sound equipment was very heavy, fortunately it is now light and has sound equipment included. This is a much better situation for recording the activities he undertakes. Michael has been interested in Mount Everest from age 8 and first saw it in 1969.

Michael mentioned some events and illustrated these with wonderful film.

Events he detailed included a trip up the Ganges from the mouth to the mountains with Sir Edmund Hillary, "Ocean to Sky." This was a difficult trip as conditions in the Ganges were largely unknown and variable... he did not recommend drinking the water! They were not able to navigate the waterfalls so the trip continued overland. During the trip Edmund Hillary suffered from Altitude sickness and was very ill, however he recovered and was able to continue his work of more than 40 years improving the conditions of the Sherpas. Schools and Hospitals have been included with many of the children being successful in professional life and have returned to work in their villages.

Michael showed members the treks of Tim McCartney-Snape on his trek from the sea to the summit of Mt Everest, and the Australian ascent from the Tibetan side without Oxygen in 1988. Avalanches were always a danger and Michael lost equipment in one. It was safer to climb at night, as weather conditions are more stable.

The 'Social Club' has had some mad escapades, holding the world's highest dinner party with much fun and frivolity. Whilst in the Himalayas Michael developed Malaria. His ambulance down to medical care was by donkey.

Several other adventures were mentioned including a trip by London Cab from London to Singapore then from Perth to Sydney. He also joined for the closing miles with another traveler and his dog 'Tippy" on a horseback ride from Mongolia to Hungary. Michael also told of Lincoln Hall, who reached the summit 25 years after his first attempt. One of the parties died, then Lincoln became very ill and despite encouragement from others in the camp and help from the Sherpas he had to be left alone. He regained consciousness and with help from other climbers he was rescued and returned to base camp three days later. Unfortunately he only lived another 6 years. Michael has also filmed treks on the Kokoda Trail and has participated on many charity walks.
