Guest Speaker: Jessie Harmon.

Jessie commented that Ocean Grove was the second largest Club in the District behind Ballarat South. She is a member of the Rotary International Board which governs 48,000 Clubs and 80 Secretariats. It is comprised of 17 directors from throughout the world each with a two year term plus the President and Deputy President. Jessie's term finishes in June. She outlined a number of decisions recently made to keep Rotary strong into the future.

Women in Rotary: Women were first admitted in 1989. There are currently 280,000 women members or one-quarter of the membership and they take 30% of the leadership roles. There are seven on the Board and the first female President, Jennifer Jones, is currently serving.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion: Board has adopted a statement aiming to make Rotary more representative of the communities it serves. A Taskforce has been formed to advise the Board and an operational plan and learning resources commissioned. RI will support Action Groups to bring diverse people together. These principles are everyone's responsibility and are part of the objectives of Rotary.

New Types of Rotary Clubs: These include Satellite Clubs, E Clubs, and Passport Clubs. Other Clubs are formed from Alumni members of programs, Corporate Clubs of employees of a business or profession, and Interest Group Clubs. These expand our reach to those who would not join traditional clubs.

Environment: added as 7th area of focus aiming to increase the number of environmentally sensitive projects. Foundation funds use to support projects and it results in new partners.

Peace: has been at the heart of Rotary since it was founded. Rotary was involved in the establishment of the U.N. and UNESCO. Peace Clubs were started in the 1990s and the latest one formed in Turkiye.

Regionalisation: The same Rotary model has been used all around the world but with different patterns of performance. Some areas are thriving while others are declining, including the south Pacific region. Rotary needs to be more responsive to local needs. Our area has voted in favour of a new model. The impact at Club level should be minimal but it may result in more support resources being available and the establishment of a Regional Council to coordinate interdistrict activities.
