



- **Rotary south pacific** has appointed a member director – **David Barton**. He is from the Rotary club of Melville.
- Last week saw the end of the **16 days of activism against family violence**. There were many excellent speakers.
- Lyndy suggested that over the Xmas break you should talk to your children and grandchildren about:
 - - family violence

Xmas in the Grove: A most successful evening was conducted to celebrate 'Xmas in the Grove'. Our club was very much in evidence and judging by the pics, our activities provided a popular destination for kids.



Guest Speaker: Larrie Winzar: Larrie Winzar shared her experiences from a recent visit to Tanzania, focusing on her work with the School of St. Jude. She donated 21 copies of her book, "Living with Passion and Purpose," and mentored the careers team via Zoom.

Larrie stayed at the school, which is funded primarily by Australians, and visited a government school to contrast facilities. She also went on a safari, highlighting the contrast between urban and wildlife areas.

Larrie plans to distribute her book's profits to support women and girls globally, with potential expansion to other developing regions.

She also mentioned upcoming talks by the Founder of St Judes, in February, to raise awareness about the school and the opportunity for members to travel to the area - being organised by Geelong Central RC. Larrie has initiated contact with several hosts for the school founder's talks in Australia in February 2023.

Larrie support her presentation with a series of pictures from The School of St Jude, the wildlife area and urban districts that she visited. She detailed how well she was looked after by members of the School of St Jude community as well as the hospital where she had the need to visit.

Larrie indicated that she will be transferring from RC Bendigo to RC Ocean Grove at the start of January next year. Welcome Larrie !
