Aquabox Program:

\$200 has been used to purchase two Aquaboxes which have been filled by members with useful goods for supplying to relief agencies overseas in disaster areas. The boxes are then used with a filter cartridge and a supply of water treatment tablets to sanitise and purify 1,000 litres of polluted water, making it safe and pleasant to drink. This equates to around 5,000 cups – enough for a family of 4 drinking 10 cups of water daily for approximately 4 months.

The Vocational Service Committee has had a productive year with a range of activities being undertaken. The program for the year 2002-2003 has included the following.

Vocational Workplace Visit. Members of the club enjoyed a successful visit to the Great Southern Waters marine farm at Indented Heads. Members were amazed at the scope of the operation, the environmental procedures employed and the scientific management program employed in the breeding and management of the shellfish.

The club then enjoyed some Greek hospitality at the Katiola restaurant at Portarlington. Ocean Grove Rotary Club was the first industry visit by a club to this new business. To enable us to visit the business at an appropriate time in their breeding schedule, the visit was carried out in February instead of the traditional month of October

Job Talks. Members of the club offered to do job talks, as always these proved to be very interesting.

Vocational Training. Two programs of certificate two in First Aid were carried out. Certificate two in First Aid is the minimum certificate required by the DLI for tradesmen to have on the job. RAWCS

Also, as part of this area of International, we again funded the education of our two Indonesian students "Triyani" & "Silvester".

Interplast:

Due to the Bali bomb blast, Interplast was also a high priority, so December saw us sending \$2000, and then another \$2000 allocated in April.

The volunteers involved in this amazing reconstructive surgery do indeed need our constant support, and I commend the Board for their commitment to this project.

Rotary Foundation

Whilst we are all aware of the wonderful work being funded throughout the world by Rotary Foundation, most of us are not aware that we only raise around \$US1.8 million annually in Australia, yet we spend around \$U\$3.2 million - leaving a shortfall of approximately \$U\$1.5 million that has to be funded by other countries. Members may have to give more serious thought to supporting Foundation in other ways in the future if we wish to continue our Australian programs.

Other Donations:

Polio Plus has been the main focus of our International funding this year. The final push to eradicate polio throughout the world has seen our club allocate \$5000 to the cause. This was achieved with the help of a very successful Dinner Auction run by John & Nanette Calnin and a band of willing helpers.

MARKET REPORT

This was, by far, the most successful year for the market, realising \$23,560 in total banking, up more than \$6300 on the previous season and more than \$15,000 higher than the 1997/98 season. It was also the most momentous in terms of changes in personnel and sites.

At the beginning of the season, we lost Dennis Wootten from his regular duties at the front gate after many years of sterling service, and also Eric Bare, who, with Rod Birrell, handled the road and temporary Park signs for every market for as long as I can remember. Dennis was replaced by expanding the roster of members, but Rod took on the signage job on his own, a huge job], and also took over many of my duties from February onwards.

Christy Abrahams assumed responsibility for the monthly raffle goods, and her efforts are well reflected in the net revenue of \$2857, compared with \$2027 in the previous season. She also joined Alison George in selling tickets to the stallholders, and the two of them rarely left before the end of the market.

Another new member on the committee was Rod Bush, who ably supported Tony Haines on site management. To place up to 115 stallholders on site in less than an hour was a tremendous effort. We averaged 97 occupied stalls, and 1105 visitor's cars.

This season also saw the re-introduction of the crayfish spins, with our very own spinning wheel, and 30 crustaceans returned a net \$1395, thanks in particular to Ian Walker.

I am particularly grateful to Tony Haines, a truly stalwart Rotarian, who was my right hand man for the entire season, and who stepped willingly and most efficiently into my shoes for the last three markets, due to my 'hearty' extra-curricular activities. To do all that as well as his secretarial duties for the Club was a mighty effort.

I have now come to the end of a six-year term of office which has given me great satisfaction. I could never have done it without the support of my committee and the always cheerful and continuing support and encouragement of my fellow Rotarians. It also required a lot of patience and constant support from Jan, who will, in future, take quite a few less phone calls, and visit the bank less frequently.

This is a wonderful club project, and I am sure I leave it in good hands.
