## Guest speaker: John Duthie - Short History of the B Heads Bluff.

John Duthie, an environmentalist, discussed the significance of the Barwon Heads Bluff, highlighting its geological and ecological importance. The Bluff, a local icon, features Mount Co Light, Point Flinders, and a Marine Sanctuary. It hosts 650-700 species in its sand dunes and salt marshes, and 13,000 species in Bass Strait. The speaker detailed the Bluff's history, including its formation 1 million years ago and its erosion by 1980. Friends of the Bluff, formed in 1994, focuses on natural regeneration and education. They conduct citizen science, such as Clean Up Australia Day, fish counts, and bio blitzes, to monitor environmental changes and engage the community.



## Introduction and Background of the John Duthie

- John introduces himself, thanking Lyndy for the invitation and hospitality.
- Mentions the focus of the talk will be on the Barwon Heads Bluff.
- Describes the Bluff as a local icon, a place for walking, jogging, and cycling, and a significant geological and marine protected area.


