Cameron explained the group and personal partnerships which have been formed and are so necessary to provide information to coaches and if necessary health and physical care for the athletes. Opportunities are also provided for outstanding athletes to rub shoulders with some of Australia's Olympic, Paralympic, Commonwealth and World Champions at the Victorian Institution of Sport as well as participating in nutrition, stretching, strength and conditioning sessions. Many athletes have education about Driver Safety from Sponsor TAC. Deakin University, as a sponsor is involved in information sessions on pathways and options for athletes looking to study in the health, sport and fitness industry. Sports Psychology and wellbeing sessions are conducted involving parents as well as adolescent athletes focusing on the areas of sleep, diet, mindfulness, stress and exercise and how they can impact on mental health and physical wellbeing.

Fundraising events are also held to enable athletes to compete in competitions locally, nationally and overseas. Information sessions and events are also held for Friends of BSA.

A mentoring program is also available as well as recognition of achievements in athletes chosen sports. In 2018 BSA had 46 athletes represent at state, 10 at national and 7 at international level. From 2008 - 2018 the BSA has supported 1007 talented athletes, partnered with over 14 state sporting associations as well as individuals from 23 more associations and programs. Successes include 5 World Champions, 2 Olympians, 3 compete at Paralympic games and 2 at Commonwealth Games.

Sponsorship and fundraising is also very important with 26 entities and organisations involved, and of course more are needed if the Academy is to continue to operate at its current level and achieve the success it currently enjoys. Most members and partners spent some time in the museum attached to the facility where much of the memorabilia is associated with the Geelong Cats Football.

The group enjoyed a meal at the 'Man Bo' Chinese Restaurant across the road. It was value for money as the format was a banquet meal organised by Lynne Carlson. Well done Lynn.
