#### Guest Speaker: Jacinta Ramsay, Hair Aid

Jacinta was introduced by Lisa Hanley. She is the Victorian coordinator of the program which gives free haircuts to those who cannot afford them. She is also a hairdressing teacher at Gordon TAFE and works part-time in a local salon. She travels to Asia, particularly Indonesia and the Philippines, with teams of people to train local people in simple hair cutting techniques.



Jacinta presented a short video, 'Changing Lives One Cut At a Time', showing the work of Hair Aid.

Hair Aid was began in 2010 by Selina Tomasich who saw the work of a convent of sisters in Manila helping poor, abandoned children. The sisters wanted to teach their parents a skill, hopefully sewing, so they could support their children. Selina was an academic at the University of the Sunshine Coast and bought a group of volunteers over to teach sewing. The next project was teaching hair cutting which led to the formation of Hair Aid. Now twenty plus hairdressers go on each project to teach locals five basic cutting skills. On completion they get a certificate and are gifted a kit of hair cutting tools. These people can then set up micro businesses to support their families. The 'Pearls of Hope' project helps keep children in school and gives employment to street people. So far, five and a half thousand people have been trained.

In addition, volunteer hairdressers in Australia give cuts to those in need. Co-Health provides meals in Mornington Peninsula and have

added a hairdressing service. Many of Jacinta's students for Gordon Institute volunteer in this service. Hair Aid also works with Ronald McDonald House giving cuts to residents. Many charities are asking for volunteers but numbers have reduced since Covid. Marion Walton mentioned that the Lazarus Centre in Geelong used to have a volunteer hair cutter but he had left. A haircut can help someone get an interview or be more accepted by society. Jacinta said that Hair Aid used to go there pre-Covid and would try and find someone else for them.



In 2018, Jacinta became a volunteer with the Salvation Army. She then went to Indonesia on her first international project. In 2020, a team of

Driftwood Cafe, OG Cellars, Ian Pattison Jewellers, Piping Hot Chicken Shop, Viewpoint Digital Media, OG Bar, Wardrobe by the Sea, Bellarine Eye care, Bay IT, Bells by the Beach, Laminar, OG Hardware, OG NewsXPress, Pavilion Property, Ocean Eyes, OG Super Toys, Covenant Wine Bar, Roche Accounting, Bakers Delight hairdressers taught the first course in a prison in Manila as a means of rehabilitation. They will be returning for another prison project soon. They use Australians who are in these prisons as translators. The people in these projects are often communities who live in rubbish dumps as scavengers which can involve hundreds of people. Governments are attempting to remedy this situation and so accept the Hair Aid program as part of this process. Others are people who have experienced trauma such as sex trafficking. Children in orphanages have often been taken off the streets after being involved in the sex trade. Hair Aid works with other organisations who are helping these people.

Trainees get a kit only if they complete the five cut course. The contents of the kits are donated by various organisations and often include second hand tools from the hairdressing industry. Those in gaol get the kit when they are released. The volunteers cover their costs including air fares themselves or from fundraising through the State organisation.

On behalf of the Club, Rod Bush gave a donation of \$500 to Hair Aid.

#### President's Report: Lynne Carlson

Last week, Rod mentioned a young girl with multiple allergies whose grandfather had approached the Club for help. A retired doctor, Bernie Jenner has made contact with the family. He will work out what can be done to help them locally.

At this stage, about fourteen members have indicated that they intend to attend the District Conference in Mount Gambier next year.
