Guest Speaker: Gavin Burke.

Gavin spoke to us quite openly about his experiences in the training and carrying out duties in the Australian Army. He is one of nine children brought up in Geelong. He went to Duntroon in the ACT where he learnt to be a leader in the infantry and a Commander of soldiers. He was one of 20 graduates in1982. There they learned how to cope and bond together in the Military. They were taught at Puckapunyal that staff must be flexible and everyone is replaceable but the Army must go on. The staff must be able to think and adapt to all situations.

Gavin also worked as the Sergeant in the Victorian Parliament and provided some entertaining anecdotes of his time there.
