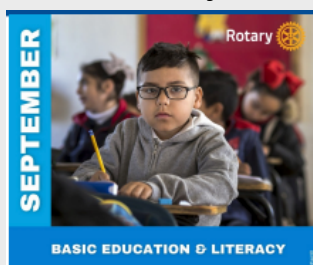

Regionalisation: Gil Morgan. All members are asked to read the information recently sent on email as we are expected to form an opinion so an informed vote can be made on the future organisation and function of our organization at Club, Regional and International levels.

Guest Speaker: Loretta Hart. "Escabags."

Loretta is a journalist, broadcaster and podcaster. She is also a member of the 'Salty Dogs', an all weather swimming group. She is a local and once had close association with Van Loons Nursery. She learned about Escabags about three years ago. The organisation was commenced in 2020 in Wollongong by Stacey Jane, (who escaped from an abusive relationship in England in 1919) and is based on the realisation that families and individuals escaping from domestic or family violence need

essential articles as they find their way to freedom. Leaving the place of abuse can be very dangerous so bags are placed in places where people go during everyday activities. A short video emphasising this was shown. There are over 1000 outlets around Australia, and in 2023 there were approximately 8000 bags distributed. Bags

are free, contents are donated and are suitable for single adults or an adult and children. They are packed in Wollongong and distributed to specified areas not publicly broadcast as word-of-mouth information is usually safer.

The web site for the organisation www.escabags.org is worthwhile as the mission statement and values clearly define how people in need can gain help and reassurance.

"Helping one person might not change the world, but it may change the world for one person."

Family violence recognition and awareness is the project for the District Governors year and it is hoped the board will be able to assist Escabags in its work. It is also hoped that the Club will promote awareness of family violence and its negative effects through being informed about
