Foundation Report

The Club currently has 37 Paul Harris Fellows, nine of whom have one or more sapphire pins, and three have one or more ruby pins. The granting of a Paul Harris Fellow is in recognition of a donation to The Rotary Foundation of \$US1,000.

In addition to individual contributions, during the year the Club donated a further \$3,000 to the Rotary Foundation.

Ten members contributed to the Centurion programme (a contribution of \$100), and it is expected that an additional two Centurions contributions will be made this Rotary year.

Three members continued their membership of the Paul Harris Society. Membership of the PHS involves making annual contributions to the Rotary Foundation of \$US1,000.

To date the Ocean Grove Rotary Club has contributed (all time giving) a total of \$118,537 to The Rotary Foundation.

The Club continues to qualify for Global and District Grants, and has made a submission for a District Grant.

Public Relations Report

Throughout the last 12 months the main focus has been to get Rotary's message across via social media. To this end we published 64 posts linked to the week to week activities of the club mainly relating to guest speakers at our weekly meetings. Other posts were related to the summer monthly markets which have been very successful. Additionally we published 7 boosted posts ie we paid for our messages to reach additional people other than those linked to Rotary's facebook page.

This resulted in reaching over 31,000 people and receiving over 1600 post engagements about our message, meaning the message resonated with these 1600 people and they were intending to act upon it. This was particularly important given most of the “boosted” messages related to the summer markets.

We have been well supported throughout the year by the local Ocean Grove “Voice” newspaper as they are only too happy to support us in getting our messages out to the public. Examples of their support are articles published about playground recycling, Vocational Community awards, Junior Community awards, the Art Show and many more.

Nationally Rotary is keen for local clubs to consult with their local community on what their particular needs are and how Rotary can help. We will be working on this project throughout the coming year in the hope of gaining a better understanding of how our club can help the community.

Community Service Report

Lookout Reserve

By the end of June, we will have held a planting day in conjunction with CoGG to infill the native vegetation areas. Several advanced shade trees will also have been planted.

Landscape architect, Perry Mills has delivered a “Concept Master Plan”. Gordon King and I met with CoGG parks and open space officers to discuss further action. The concept plan was endorsed on condition that each significant project we undertake will be vetted by council officers.

Members continue to monitor the state of the reserve on a fortnightly basis and keep it clean and tidy. Council have replaced the rusted frames of the history panels.

We are now aware of the complexity in the process for the name of the reserve to be changed to reflect Rotary’s involvement. Looking at additional signage instead.

Ocean Grove Nature Reserve

By the end of June, we will have installed two new picnic tables on galvanised steel frames manufactured by Rod Birrell. Materials cost approx. \$2,000 exceeded budget due to Parks requiring a more expensive timber for the tops and the ground under them to be paved as well.

Grubb Road Trail

We have had several meetings with VicRoads and CoGG re the maintenance of the Rotary-signed nature track from Thacker St to the OGNR main entry which continues to deteriorate. No progress has been made.

BSAC Sculpture Repositioning

Negotiations with Barwon Coast to reinstall it at the Surf Beach Complex were unsuccessful. However, talks with the new councillors and CoGG Arts department have been much more fruitful. Lookout Reserve now looks like it will be the location.

We have lodged an application for a District Grant of \$3,000 towards the considerable costs estimate of the consultant. We remain optimistic that CoGG will fast-track approval and contribute to funding the project.

Other Community Service-Related Activities

No collections for the district **Donations in Kind** project took place, but \$500 was provided towards transport costs.

We continued promoting the fair game called “**Corn Hole**” and used it at most markets to raise donations and community awareness. Over \$400 was collected in donations. The boards were made available to two charity events and we still have a set of boards and bags to sell or donate to aged care and sports clubs.

We assisted the **OG Coastcare** group with a revegetation project.

The club donated \$500 for sponsorship of the **OG Community Association’s** Southern Bellarine Coastal Forum held on 21st June.

The club Through Marion Walton’s group again staged the **Seniors Christmas** Event at the Bowls Club.

Members manned the **gates of the GDFL finals** football on 6 days and were rewarded with a donation of \$4,000. Thanks Peter Cullen.

Following a request to Board, a contribution of \$6,875 was made to purchase a treatment chair for the **Barwon Health** Mobile Consulting Vehicle.
