COMMITTEE REPORTS

Vocational Committee

We are currently reviewing progress with this year's Community Awards Project before making plans for next year. We are developing strategies to get more nominations for Volunteer Organisations and Apprenticeships. Next year we are considering introducing a popularity or people choice award for the entity which receives the most nominations and will review the prize money.

We will continue with the Anzac Day packages in conjunction with Ty Symons. This year packing will be done at Ty's new shed, located at 4 Smithton Road, next to Kerr's Hire. This will involve the whole club. We are looking for a new project and will approach volunteer organisations to see if they have something that we can participate in. A vocational visit to SeaRoad Ferries including a trip to Sorrento and a High Tea is being considered.

Community and Environment Committee

Our original White Mangrove Plan has been delivered to the Corangamite Catchment Management Authority to be considered for inclusion in the (Places of Many Stories) Rivers of Barwon Action masterplan which will be released for Public Consultation in the next few weeks. We hope that by informing the public of our plans that people will vote to include our ideas in the final draft of the Masterplan.

Future plans include:

- * a BBQ for Feed Me Bellarine on their premises at the beginning of May with all proceeds going to them.
- * Re-investigate the possibility of setting up a WERN program.
- * Continue to maintain the Lookout Reserve and the 100 Trees.
- * Work with Ocean Grove Park on replacing trees.
- * Invite speakers from Ambulance Victoria on CPR, Geelong Council Environment Department on waste recycling.
- * The plague will be attached to the Sand digger next week.
- * Check with Police about numbers of people sleeping in cars in our area.

* It was suggested that we giver \$100 vouchers to four op shops for people in need of warm clothing.

Youth Committee

Junior Community Award - new leaders for the program for 2024 are needed with Tony Haines and Judy Greer planning to step down. Paul Brewster, Jenny Wright and Lyndy Stagg have offered to take on the role of leadership with Tony and Judy on hand to act as mentors. Extra assistants for working with the individual students will be needed - Heather Willson and Meredith may be available. Progress report for this year is as follows - Star of the Sea 19 participants, Surfside 15, Wallington 8, Ocean Grove to be determined. Visits to schools will be made at least twice a term during terms 2 and 3. The program will conclude during week 1, Term 4 and presentations will take place shortly after. Meredith has prepared an Appendix of Activities to be used as a resource when assisting Students.

Tony expressed a concern relating to a student doing Community Service at Cherished Pets a non-profit organisation but with some paid staff and with the child being under 14 years in terms of Child Employment Laws. Meredith will follow up with some safety checks in relation to Child Safe Standards, W.W.C. and legal requirements and discuss further with the Board. Meredith informed the meeting there is a new District Code of Conduct which we need to follow.

Rotary Youth Exchange is back. Board has a letter from a potential outbound student. Moved that we consider the matter but do not go ahead at this time, for 2024. Students need to between 14 1/2 and 17 1/2 at 1st July. Moved Heather, seconded Paul. District RYLA is going ahead. Difficultly in sourcing applicants was discussed. Defying the Drift - with visitors from Bellarine North Rotary Club present Meredith put forward idea of a combined initiative. Program is in September.

International Committee

- * ShelterBox stall at Easter Monday market will not go ahead.
- * Bali Smiles we are preparing for the next sponsorship year, translated reports are on the Club website.
- * Cambodia teacher trainees have completed their training, report is on the web site. Project in conjunction with RC Phenom Peng and RC Highton. The Committee is considering options for continued support via RCPP.
- * Playground demolition no more demolitions planned for this year. Photos of the official opening have been received for a playground that was shipped to and constructed in Sri Lanka.
- * Indonesia The Club has donated 4 folding tables and acrylic stands to assist with the dog desexing program.
