Community and Environment Committee Report

Community Projections

- 1. The OG Entry Identification project will continue
- 2. The Lookout Reserve clean up will continue, and there will be more planting when the Council decide to go ahead with this.
- 3. The Committee is considering ways in which we can help the homeless people in our area. We would like to have a speaker from a suitable group to give us more information on the problem, perhaps from the Salvation Army or Samaritan House. Samaritan House currently is running a Winter Appeal so might be available for a speaker.
- 4. The group has proposed setting up a free BBQ so that people in need can have a free meal. This would have to be in conjunction with another group such as Feed me Bellarine or a church, and needs more consideration. One of the committee has offered to fund it.
- 5. Could we have a meal at Feed me Bellarine and each pay \$25. Could this be on a Rotary night. ?
- 6. Could we have a 'poor man's supper' and ask Ty to provide only sandwiches at one Rotary meeting, but we would still pay \$25 and give the balance to Feed me Bellarine'.
- 7. The group is also investigating the situation with prisoners when they are released from prison and can end up back on the streets. We would like a speaker on the subject.

Environment

- 1. The maintenance of the trees continues, but we need to deal with the weeds in between the trees. We have asked BCN for a quote to help us with this as we need larger equipment than we possess. There would be a cost involved with this.
- 2. The Aboriginal sign for the tree planting- Gobata Bengadak- is now ready . Do we want a ceremony to attach it to the original sign? Have a BBQ? Or Tea and Home Baking? Invite Councillors?
- 3. We plan to plant some understory plants to give good ground cover and help reduce the weeds. The planting would take place next Autumn, and we will need a budget for that.
- 4. We have met with some of the committee of the Ocean Grove Park Association with a view to replacing some of the trees in the park. They require a lot of trees so this will be a bigger project than first thought. It will be carried out overtime. Again a budget will be required.
- 5. We have also offered to assist with the replacement of the children's play digger in the Park. This would really be a community project. We have investigated the costs and they range from \$3500 to \$5000.
- 6. The club could perhaps get involved with a beach cleanup to remove rubbish from the local beach.
- 7. Our group has offered to assist the OG Reserve Association with the clean up and restoration of the information centre in the reserve. This could be both financial and 'hands on' help.

There will be a Committee meeting next Tuesday, 19th to hold further discussion and decide on a Budget for our projects, once we have a broad approval from the Board.

International Committee 2022-23

Our aim is to participate in Rotary projects which aid international understanding and friendship. The preference is for educational or health projects for children and young adults.

We will organise guest speakers in the international area. We will encourage diversity within the Club and advocate for an inclusive community.

- Bali Smiles continue to support Indonesian school students to attend school through Jan Johansen's charity. Assist with the running of the Emergency Services charity day at the 13th Beach par 3 golf course – proceeds are being donated to Bali Smiles. The Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak is aware and interested in this project. Jan Johansen spoke to the Club last Rotary year. 6 secondary students now being sponsored.
- Cambodia continue to partner with RC Highton and RC Phnom Penh to support two trainee teachers through PEPY (<u>https://pepyempoweringyouth.org/</u>) who are completing their last year of tuition and moving into their first teaching placements. Investigate sponsorship of primary school students.
- Papua New Guinea this is a new project with RC Torquay to support the work of John Oswald and Lucy Loko (RC Geelong). This year will be investigation of a way to assist and then funding provided.
- Myanmar this is a District Grant for the installation of a water filter in partnership with Safe Water for Every Child Myanmar. The district grant application for \$5,000 was submitted in the 2021-22 Rotary year and if approved will be implemented this Rotary year. Fleur Maidment spoke last Rotary year on the importance of clean, safe drinking water to villages.
- Nepal supporting Seven Women a charitable organisation empowering woman by providing ways to financially support themselves. Stephanie Woollard spoke to the Club via zoom last Rotary year. 8 students now being sponsored.
- Indonesia investigate a way to support Dr Charlie El-Hage in his work in Indonesia with desexing clinics for dogs and vaccinations against rabies. It is possible this may see a District Grant applied for this Rotary year. Charlie is training Indonesian vets in the hope to make the project sustainable.
- ShelterBox continue to promote ShelterBox via an information stall at 2 summer markets. Encourage the Club to continue with financial support of ShelterBox.

Provide information to the Club via short video clips/

- Donations in Kind continue to support DIK in Geelong and look to arrange a visit to the warehouse. Encourage the Club to continue with the financial support of DIK.
- Operation Cleft continue to work with RC Box Hill to fund operations for children born with cleft palates. Last Rotary year we funded 6 operations in Bangladesh.
- Playgrounds Rotary Overseas Recycled Playgrounds arranges for dismantled playgrounds to be shipped overseas to be re-erected for children to play. Over the last couple of years three Borough of Queenscliffe playgrounds were dismantled and sent to the Philippines. All playgrounds are replaced with a new playground in the Borough.
