### **Guest Speaker, Kate Halfpenny**

Kate has been a journalist with several newspapers and worked for many years with Who Magazine. She received an award for her reporting of the Port Arthur massacre. She recently moved to Ocean Grove. She has two children.



Kate has been interested in reading and writing all her life. She grew up in Bicheno in Tasmania where her parents ran a hotel. Her childhood was idyllic and free and she developed a love of the seaside. She took a cadetship at the Melbourne Herald. She loved the work although the salary was low and attitudes towards women staff very stereotyped. In those days, reporting occurred without today's technical support. She then went to London where she worked with Piers Morgan. When she came home, she married, had children and worked for Who Magazine for twenty years. There she met and interviewed many famous and interesting people including Chris Hemsworth, Shane Warne, and Guy Pearce. She was well treated at the magazine and found the work stimulating, challenging and enjoyable.

She gave up journalism and worked in communications / public relations but realised that had not been a good choice. In 2021 she gave that away and moved to Ocean Grove to be near a beach. She is now working freelance, writing a column for the Age / Sydney Morning Herald each week. She finds 'ordinary' people often have the most interesting stories to tell. She always tries to answer questions honestly but has learnt to be careful with comments



as a columnist. She has also learnt to accept adverse comments made on social media as part of life.

### ROTARY DISTRICT 9780 CONFERENCE 2022, PORT FAIRY

Although smaller than in previous years, this conference demonstrated that Rotarians want to get together, something that has been missing over the past two years. and everyone emerged alive. Due to limited numbers, only three of us got into the dinner.

Nevertheless, it was extremely good and we enjoyed the company of some 'Ballaratians' on our table. Keynote speakers at the Conference focused on issues associated with humanity and the environment. Brief summaries of some of the most impactful presentations are given below.



There were several presentations on heath and education issues in developing countries. Below its beautiful environment, Nepal suffers from extreme poverty and women,

particularly those with disabilities fall to the bottom of society. Louise Harper, a midwife, spoke about the Women's Health Project run by Dr. Ray Hodgson. They treat hundreds of young women who have been rejected by their husbands and villages after suffering genital prolapse. The dream is to build a modern Mothers and Babies Hospital. Progress was interrupted by an earthquake and Covid but fundraising has accelerated since Rotary became involved. Rotary Foundation has committed to fitting out the hospital. A book by Ray Hodgson, Heartbreak in the Himalayas can be bought online www.A4WH.org. Catherine and Sief reported on their Bandari Project in Tanzania where they have built a school for 120 students near Sief's home village. They educate children from the most impoverished households who could not afford to attend Tanzania's limited Government schools. They also have vegetable, fish and fruit farms which they use to feed the children when at school. The project is supported by the Port Fairy and other Rotary clubs. They need to raise \$100,000 per annum to keep the school going. They are pleased to attend Rotary Clubs to speak about their project. John Oswald from Torquay Rotary introduced Lucy Loko who spoke of their proposed project to

rebuild the **School at Lese Oalai** which is 200 km from Port Moresby, PNG very near to the Torres Strait Islands.

They need new classrooms, toilets and a clean water supply and are working with local Rotary clubs and leaders to raise \$500,000 for the rebuild. Schools in nearby villages are in worse disrepair and their students have come to Lese Oalai exacerbating the problem.

Simone O'Brien, **Say No to Domestic Violence**, told her horrific story as a survivor of domestic violence. After trying to break up with a man she met online, he bashed her with a baseball bat, breaking her arm, her skull and smashing her face in an attempted murder situation. She now talks to schools, football and netball clubs and other workplaces encouraging people to report domestic violence before the situation gets to this stage. She identified the red flags as controlling behaviour, belittling attitudes towards partners, stealing, telling lies and inconsiderate actions. She encouraged victims to say No, and for everyone to look out for each other. On a happier note, Lachlan Farrington from the **Nature Glenelg Trust** spoke about this organisation's efforts to restore wetlands in southwest Victoria and south-east South Australia as well as Adelaide and Tasmania. Fifty percent of wetlands in Victoria and 70% in S.A. have been drained and those remaining are compromised. The Trust is a non-profit private organisation which purchases land or works with local farmers to preserve and restore significant wetlands to help protect threatened and endangered species such as the Australasian Bittern, Brolgas, growling grass frogs, native fish and eastern swamp crayfish. They can be contacted at info@ngt.org.au. They also run a Bittern recovery program.
