

Meeting 9 May 2023

Guest Speaker: Moses Pulop-Levey.



Moses was born in in a small village in a remote area approximately 6 hours from Mt Hargen in Papua New Guinea. His father was the village chief, his mother was his third wife and he had four siblings. His father died when he was 4 years of age. His Mother remarried into a rival village where relationships were difficult, and childhood was a matter of survival. The skills and practice of hunting and gathering was needed to maintain life. He adopted a stray dog at this time who became his best friend. He

felt it supported him through some very hard times. He thoroughly enjoyed a meal his sister prepared only to be very traumatised when he found the meat was his dog. He believes this was the impetus to make him leave the village and with a little help from his older brother, he managed to reach a town. He barely managed to exist, relying on food waste from a religious institution and sometimes handouts from schools.

He was eventually 'rescued' by a missionary couple, who adopted him when he was 8, (providing he barracked for Collingwood). Eventually he came to Australia. Moses had never seen white people before and he thought they were angels. He learnt English, went to school and through hard work and a fair amount of determination eventually went to university. All of this was very hard, but he accepted the opportunity that was given to him.

He remains very sad and concerned for the children in the villages, as their lives remain hard, and their futures are uncertain. Moses showed a video of the people gathering water in the mountains at the nearest point to the village, about 3 or 4 miles away. A drink was only taken if you were thirsty.

With involvement of RI Mount Martha, he has been able to organise a clean water supply for his village, including tanks and piping carrying water from the mountains. The Kornea and Sigri Water Project has been implemented with further help from Rotary. He was very happy to acknowledge that this project was completed in 6 weeks at a cost of \$25,000.

A further project is being planned in a nearby village, Ingin. Moses has not had a lot of contact with his mother even though she has returned to his village. He has managed to maintain language and cultural links with the village and early life.

Moses has been a Cardiac Nurse for several years and is currently working in the cardiac unit at Epworth Hospital at Deakin University. He lives in Torquay with his wife and their two children. His determination and belief in the need to change human lives was evident and very compelling.

He seems to be a man sure of his convictions and care for others. A very enjoyable and thought provoking presentation.


• Footy Tipping: Alex Magee won this week. Geoff Brentnall is leading the competition.
