addition, hyper vigilance, fight or flight reaction triggers and migraine. He had been working in a 'wild' town where robbery and mayhem frequently occurred, anything from attacks from ferocious guard dogs to attempted murder.

Over twenty per cent of the 15,000 officers in the police



force suffer from PTSD and are in need of care and assistance. The Victorian Government does not offer much assistance but some care is being offered on a limited basis. Admission of symptoms and having difficulties was seen as being 'weak' and were invalided out.

Bob worked with the CIB in the child exploitation unit and found this very difficult. He had also worked in most other areas of policing over his fifteen years in the force. Eventually, he left the force after an encounter with a murderer who wanted 'suicide by cop'. He fell to rock bottom and became suicidal. He left the force without any acknowledgement of his work. Bob became a sole parent which forced him to change. After 25 years he was diagnosed with PTSD. He went to University achieving a PHD, took up sport, remarried and joined a Lions Club.

Janice Prest said they were keen to help and support other police officers. They work with many veterans and the numbers needing help are increasing. The organisation is not funded and they need more people who have served in the police force to help with the work. She served with the Victorian police in the 1970s and 1980s. Help for retired members is not forthcoming from the Victorian Police organisation.

A donation of \$500 was given the Police Veterans Victoria from the Club.


