for playgrounds in Sri Lanka. Following investigation it was found other countries were happy to receive the landfill bound equipment from Australia. So the RORP project was born. A fist container with 7 playgrounds is on the sea to Colombo.

There are promises/offers of enough playgrounds to fill a third container. Rod feels the project can only grow as awareness is increasing as are the number of Clubs involved.

The project commenced with RI Flemington and now involves 11 Clubs as well as Donations in Kind. This is a very worthwhile project that will no doubt have great outcomes. There is another playground ready for attention at the Lake Drive Reserve. Rod has a list for volunteers. Shelter Box and equipment will be at the next market.

The Club continues to support the Solemaid School in Bangladesh, Interplast, Shelter Box and ROMAC.
