Every Rotarian should attend an International Convention. The Convention is where you get the perspective of what Rotary is. This will be our best chance to attend as it is on our doorstep.

Work started on this 4 years ago as the bid had to be made 4 years in advance, and the whole project involves a lot of teamwork and partnerships.

Partners involved- Melbourne Convention and Entertainment Centre, City of Melbourne, Visit Victoria, and Melbourne Convention Bureau.

There is a Host Organization Committee, chaired by Mary Berry, and supported by two Vice Chairs. Jessie Harman is very involved.

Funding has been received from the State Government to attract International visitors, and encourage tourism. Around 23,000 people are expected to attend, many from overseas.

There are two main Venues- Rod Laver Arena, and Melbourne Entertainment and Convention Center.

The RI team were very impressed with the facilities on offer. There will be a transport plan for movement between the venues.

Indicative Program

26th May - Rotaract and Youth Exchange Pre Convention, and an AFL match 27th May - Delegate Tours, Cultural Events and Registration

28th May - Opening Ceremony at Rod Laver Arena 29th - 31 May. Speakers, Break-our Sessions, Hospitality, Dinners and Tours 31st - Closing Ceremony.

Currently working through a list of speakers and entertainers. There will be a mix of events and tours throughout the Convention time.


