Guest Speaker: Brendan McCartney.

Brendon was the previous coach of Ocean Grove Football Club from 1993 and throughout his career has been involved in 14 Grand Finals.

Throughout his career he has been involved with the football clubs of Ocean Grove, Carlton, Essendon, Geelong, Footscray and at present, Melbourne.

He regards himself as working in an industry where he can do the job his way and to win enough

games as a coach so his aims and ambitions are achieved.

He believes that people must be given an opportunity to be involved and encouraged to develop to their best ability in their own time if possible. He believes that participation in sporting activities is the best way to facilitate this development.

Team unity is very important not only in winning the grand final but in the respect the players and club earned in the town and community. Development of team unity takes many years as does the development of mechanics and tactics of the team and play. Recognition and respect for the wisdom of previous players needs to be included as their reputation has often been a major contributing influence in the decision made by young people to play. Brendon's passion about this was obvious as well as enabling people to learn the game in often ordinary as well as elite circumstances and environments where they can experience the joy of winning, the sense of loss and the desire to improve. If a high level of confidence is built trust in fellow team members will follow and hopefully become part of their personal lives which are incorporated in to their community lives as well.

Brendon plans to retire at the end of this year and to travel around country areas to try to install this into young people through talks at schools, clubs and other venues. He believes the change in management of players from parents and coaches to professional managers, media and financial consideration may have been detrimental to the full development of the players and therefore the game.
