Guest Speakers – Bellarine Community Health (bch)



Shane Dawson, CEO

Shane was born in Ballarat and lived in Hamilton until his children left home. They then went to Darwin for six years working in remote communities, then to Sydney. After that, they were in Bundaberg for 10 years. They then decided they wanted to come home

and he obtained the job at **bch**. They have three sons and three granddaughters. Shane's career was in health and particularly psychiatric services.

Bellarine Community Health is an independent community health organisation. The aim of their new Strategic Plan is to bring the community back into the organisation. They provide services in four sites on the Bellarine. It provides the community nursing and palliative care service to the Bellarine. They are also seeking to gain World Health Organisation accreditation for aged care services. The motto of **bch** is '**With You for Life**'

1. **Portarlington.** The sale of the Ann Nichol House was contentious. However, it has led to the funding of new facilities including a gym, cardiac rehabilitation, exercise groups, and a GP practice. A one-stop-shop will open on 8th April for allied health services, respite, and a food assistance program. Portarlington also has an auxiliary opportunity shop with 40 volunteers, which generates around \$100,000 a year.

2. **Point Lonsdale – Queenscliff.** A new building will open next week, 6th March. It will contain a dentist, GP practice, allied health services and gym. The Eric Tolliday units are being renovated and will reopen. The Coorabin nursing home is being renovated and will be used by visiting specialists.

3. **Ocean Grove.** This currently uses shared premises with the COGG Library. The limited space means there is limited capacity there. There is an activity group, cardiac rehabilitation, dietetics and counselling. **bch** is putting a case for new premises involving lobbying of politicians to enable an expansion of services, particularly mental health and suicide prevention.

4. **Drysdale.** This is the Child and Youth Services Hub, NDIS, and Executive Suites. It provides a range of services including speech therapy, podiatry, physiotherapy, and occupational therapy. The Youth Services Hub is based in the Drysdale school precinct with a range of services based there.



Andrew Dagg, Business Analyst, bch

Andrew is responsible for identifying innovations, organising funding and getting projects underway. One such project is their Health Care Bus. This idea emerged in September 2018 and gained Board approval in December 2018, which provided funding from the Health and Wellbeing Fund. Prestige Jayco found and converted a vehicle. In January, Ocean Grove Rotary Club agreed to help fund the project. The Bus will enable clients to see specialists and practitioners close to home. It will also help raise the profile of **bch** in the community by supporting local events.

There are 2,695 elderly people who live alone in the Bellarine, some in areas, which have few local facilities. For example, people in St. Leonards have to go to Leopold by bus and then another bus to Point Lonsdale to access services. The conversion of the mobile home motor vehicle has involved the removal of the bed, shower, toilet and cooking facilities to be replaced with treatment chairs and storage. The Rotary Club of Ocean Grove has contributed an electric podiatrist chair worth \$6,795. The Bus still needs examination lights installed and adding **bch** colours and logos including recognition of sponsors such as the Rotary Club to the outside. It will then be handed over and will start service delivery in the near future.

Answers to Questions –

Funding for **bch** is 65% from the State Government, 28% from the Commonwealth Government and the rest from fundraising. They intend to focus more on fundraising in the future to fill gaps left by government sources. They employ 165 staff, most part-time and have 145 volunteers. They want to have more volunteers in the future as the community becomes more involved. Clients pay fees as per their normal medical programs such as health care cards, Medicare, private health insurance or full fee.
