Environment:

- Continue with 100 tree maintenance. We now have permission from the Waddawurrung Corporation to use an aboriginal name for the site *Gobata Bengadak* which means in the original language We care for Everybody (we serve the community). The signs are in production and will be added on top of the original 100 tree sign.
- We are still collecting bottle tops and plastic pill sleeves.
- New projects work with Ocean Grove Park Association to plant trees to replace those destroyed last year. If possible replace the vandalized "digger" in the children's playground.
- Assist Friends of Ocean Grove Reserve in the preservation of the Information Centre by 'hands on' clean up and painting, and/ or raise some funds to assist.

Youth Services Report

The Graham Bath Junior Community Awards Program is our signature Youth Services Program that has been developed by our club. This program currently runs in four local primary schools and we will continue with this program in the 2022-23 Rotary year.

The club will continue to provide three VCE scholarships and three Citizenship Awards for students at Bellarine Secondary College. The Youth Services Committee will be considering introducing some Transition Scholarships for students who are currently in grade 6.

The Youth Services Committee will continue to support involvement in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards or RYLA program. We will also promote and support involvement in other District 9780 initiatives such as 'The Defying the Drift' program.

There are a range of Science and Technology programs that are delivered by other providers with financial support to successful applicants provided by some Rotary Clubs. The next Youth Services Committee meeting will make decisions on involvement in these programs as part of our annual program planning process.

Our club has received communication from John Clue, District Governor on changes to the Child Safety Standards. Vici Funnell, Assistant District Governor spoke with Meredith O'Neill at the recent changeover dinner about the need for clubs to update their policies and procedures to meet the mandatory requirements of the new state legislation. Meredith has read through the information on these new requirements and it appears that our Club is required to develop a Child Safety Standards Policy and update our procedures on screening Rotary members and volunteers who are working with young people. We also need a specific Code of Conduct for working with young people. Meredith will circulate draft materials to members of the Youth Services Committee and the Board for consideration at the next Board meeting.

Organisations are supposed to be complaint with the new legislation by 1 July 2022. Our club has now commenced the process of complying with the standards.

Vici Funnell also told Meredith that the district was considering legal advice on implications of these standards for Rotary clubs. We may need to make further adjustments to our policies and procedures if we receive new guidelines from the district.

Our continued involvement in some programs we have traditionally been involved in may now 'be up in the air' until we fully work through the implications of these new mandatory requirements.


Vocational Services Report
