- At the very end of the year, we negotiated a **venue change**, returning to the Ocean Grove Bowling Cub as our meeting location.

- The **Art show** was recognised as being one of the best in the district. It was a most successful event.
- We assisted in the **dismantling of playgrounds** to be sent to disadvantaged countries overseas.
- The Duck Race was very successful providing support scholarships to selected students at all local primary schools.

- We continued support for the White Mangrove proposal which has been incorporated (in principle) in future local government plans.
- We recognised small businesses, volunteers and apprentices via our Community Services awards.
- We recognised selected students at a local Secondary school and several primary schools, via scholarships and the Graham Bath student awards.
- We provided support to selected Salvation Army projects - vouchers for use at Opportunity Shops and refurbishment of storage containers on the Outreach bus.
- Several members supported the Reverse Advent Calendar program providing Christmas hampers to immigrant families.
- · We acknowledged our 7th Paul Harris Society member.
- We supported Feed me Bellarine via a variety of activities.
- We sold Rotary Cakes/Puddings to support Rotary Foundation as well as providing some to be included in Salvation Army Care packs.
- David Larkins headed up a group that sold car raffle tickets supporting the Rotary Club of Ballarat South. This raised valuable funds to support our programs.
- The Community/Environment group planted 60 new trees in Ocean Grove Park, replacing those blown down in a storm.
- We received a **Bronze Environment award** from district, acknowledging work we have done in this area.
- Kath Venters supported the Starthrower project which provides emotional care to wives unable to return to their homes in flood affected areas in N Victoria.
- We provided a BBQ and coffee for those attending the ANZAC day dawn service in Ocean Grove.
- We assisted in the distribution of **care packs** to veterans or their partners prior to ANZAC day.
- The Community committee raised funds through a range of recycling projects including plastic items, blister packs and overseas currency (coins).
- We donated hygiene packs to the Salvation Army for distribution through their Outreach Bus.
- Support of children to attend school through Seven Women in Nepal.
- We raised funds by overseeing the entry gates at the **GFDL football** grand final series over 4 weekends.
- We raised funds via a number of **Bunnings BBQs**.
- The Community committee replaced a popular piece of machinery in Ocean Grove Park - the much loved 'Digger'

- We recognised 13 life members who have provided 30 years of more of Rotary service.
- We planned and hosted a celebration of our club's 40th anniversary at 360Q in Queenscliff.




