John Karis, Vocational: Several nominations have already been received. Sponsorship support is very healthy.

Judy Greer, Youth: The Junior Community Award program is progressing.

Judy Greer, Family of Rotary: Sue Hill is awaiting appointments regarding her back problem. Coral Barker is looking better. She is now at the Grace McKellar Centre. The dialysis seems to be working well. She may be able to go home for a few days shortly.

Guest Speaker: Fleur Maidment, together with project workers Eh Shee, Thailand and Pla Taw, Myanmar. Safe Water for Every Child.

Fleur outlined her project and the effect our support has meant for its outcomes. The situation in Myanmar remains difficult especially along the Thai border. The political situation has not improved. The principles of the project include:



- Ensuring water used in the villages is safe to drink;
- * Providing sanitation to people in the border areas encouraging hygiene by washing hands, mouths and faces and proper disposal of used water.
- * Protection of the catchment areas through vegetation and protection of water sources from human and animal pollution.

A video was shown of how students are educated in how to use items and that the above principles are understood.

There are two thousand people in the communities being serviced at the moment. Numbers are expected to rise with continuing unrest at the border. The installation of water purification devices is thus very important. The next step is to train caretakers to manage the equipment in an effort to prolong its life and to maintain knowledge about the environment in Myanmar.

Presently, country people are being displaced by the army and so are unable to tend their crops so a food crisis is emerging. Some professional people who refuse to work for the regime are also fleeing. Areas of work for this project include provision of water filters and water testing, immunisation, mosquito nets, food aid and eduction of children. Equipment can be moved if necessary but has been targeted by the Army. Follow up and recording maintenance is patchy and difficult in these
