International Committee Report – March 2023

Items for update

- Article on Community Service Awards sent to Ocean Grove Voice, Bellarine Times, The Rip and Queenscliff Herald.
- Bali Smiles – three reports have been translated and on website. \$150 fee for translation to be approved.
- Cambodia teacher trainees – final scholarships have been finalised for the 3 teacher trainees. Report and photos sent to be loaded on web site.
- John Patton and his friend Charlie paid \$550AUD for tables and acrylic stands to assist with Indonesian desexing clinics. John is filling in the reimbursement form.
- Emergency Services Golf Day has changed to raise money for and support Police Veterans <https://policeveteransvic.org.au/>. Please see separate short document.

International Committee 2023-23

Our aim is to participate in Rotary projects which aid international understanding and friendship. The preference is for educational or health projects for children and young adults.

We will organise guest speakers in the international area. We will encourage diversity within the Club and advocate for an inclusive community.

- Bali Smiles – continue to support Indonesian school students to attend school through Jan Johansen's charity. Assist with the running of the Emergency Services charity day at the 13th Beach par 3 golf course – proceeds are being donated to Bali Smiles. The Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak is aware and interested in this project. Jan Johansen spoke to the Club last Rotary year. **6 secondary students now being sponsored and \$2,040 has been transferred.** An additional cost will be \$300 being the cost of translating 6 reports to English so they can be added to the Club web site. There is a suggestion that the Club could provide a basic toilet to each household for \$200 each (\$1,200 in total). Janine (Vic Pol) visited the village where Bali Smiles supports students. Planning is underway by Janine for the Emergency Services Golf Day in February.

June 22 photos of the students have been added to the website, in December the reports and a new set of photos will be available.

Janet has received three reports and is having them translated so they can be loaded on the web site.

Janet and Greg

- Cambodia - continue to partner with RC Highton and RC Phnom Penh to support two trainee teachers through PEPY (<https://pepyempoweringyouth.org/>) who are completing their last year of tuition and moving into their first teaching placements. Donation of \$2000 from Ocean Grove RC and a matching amount from Highton RC will be transferred to Phnom Penh RC. Highton RC will execute the transfer and

Phnom Peng RC will present donation to PEPY.

Photos and a brief biography of the students we are currently supporting has been requested.

In January there was a request from the RR Phnom Peng for an additional \$450AUD which was approved by Board and transferred.

Final report and photos have been received from RCPP and sent to Rod to be loaded onto the website.

Graeme and Kath

- Papua New Guinea – this is a new project with RC Torquay to support the work of John Oswald and Lucy Loko (RC Geelong). This year will be investigation of a way to assist and then funding provided. The project is available for support through RAWCS <https://directory.rawcs.com.au/41-2021-22>

Kath and Marg

- Myanmar – this is a District Grant for the installation of a water filter in partnership with Safe Water for Every Child Myanmar. The district grant application for \$5,000 was submitted in the 2021-22 Rotary year and if approved will be implemented this Rotary year. Fleur Maidment spoke last Rotary year on the importance of clean, safe drinking water to villages.

District Grant has been approved and the Board have approved transfer of money to Australian Disaster Aid. Safe Water for Every Child Myanmar is planning the implementation. Fleur is collecting the water filter when she is in Melbourne in September. Implementation is planned for December 9th to December 13th 2022. Project is completed.

Fleur, Pla Taw and Eh Shee spoke to the Club via zoom on Tuesday March 6th.

Kath and Greg

- Nepal – supporting Seven Women a charitable organisation with the mission 'Empowering marginalized women in Nepal to reach their potential through education and employment'. Stephanie Woollard spoke to the Club via zoom last Rotary year. 8 students now being sponsored to attend school. A report on the sponsored students has been received from Seven Women, the report and photos are on the Club website.

Andrea and Coral

- Indonesia – investigate a way to support Dr Charlie El-Hage in his work in Indonesia with desexing clinics for dogs and vaccinations against rabies. It is possible this may see a District Grant applied for this Rotary year. Charlie is training Indonesian vets in the hope to make the project sustainable.

Charlie El-Hage is travelling to Indonesia from 10th to 20th December and John Paton is also travelling.

John and Charlie funded tables and acrylic stands for desexing clinics in Indonesian,

John will be reimbursed.

John has indicated that the Rotary Club in Indonesia is quite disorganised and he does not believe we will be able to do a District Grant.

John and Andrea

- ShelterBox – continue to promote ShelterBox via an information stall at 2 summer markets. Encourage the Club to continue with financial support of ShelterBox. Provide information to the Club via short video clips.
The Club has donated \$3000 being three Shelter boxes to the Pakistan Flood Relief Appeal.
A quick update on the stall at the December market. It was quite busy before 11am and as it became hotter the foot traffic seemed to fall away. We raised \$90 in donations for ShelterBox which I found surprising. Many people took the flyer on Christmas gifts and some used the QR codes immediately. As a by-product I think we talked to at least 3 couples who have a connection to Rotary and may be looking for a Club over the next few years. There were also a number of people who knew about ShelterBox but had never seen the box or materials included. I don't think not having the tent impacted at all.
A donation of \$5000 was made to the Turkiye and Syria ShelterBox appeal.
The short clip of ShelterBox achievements was shown at the Club.

Peter and Geoff

- Repurposing, Reuse and Recycling Health and Education Equipment (RARE) – Donations in Kind (DIK) has been renamed to RARE we will continue to support RARE in Geelong and look to arrange a visit to the warehouse. Encourage the Club to continue with the financial support of RARE.

- Operation Cleft – continue to work with RC Box Hill to fund operations for children born with cleft palates. Last Rotary year we funded 6 operations in Bangladesh.

Over the last couple of years three Borough of Queenscliffe playgrounds were dismantled and sent to the Philippines. All playgrounds are replaced with a new playground in the Borough.

Minutes of Community and Environment Meeting

Date - 28th Feb, Time - 5 pm

We reviewed the goals and achievements in this Rotary Year.

Community

1. Feed Me Bellarine - \$1000 raised at our 'Simple Meal' in January . The club attended a Wasted Dinner in FMB premises in November organized by the Social committee, and we plan to hold a BBQ in May on the FMB premises where customers pay by donation and all money goes the charity. A Rotary member has offered to pay for the BBQ food. This will probably be on the first Saturday in May and we will be looking for volunteers to assist.
2. Homelessness. - We collected blankets , doonas, pillows etc for the Salvation Army to deliver to people living in cars. The club donated money to the Lazarus Centre. As we haven't yet found a speaker on the subject we wondered if the local police would have an idea of numbers of people sleeping rough or in cars. - Discuss with Kath Venters. There is a suggestion to reinvestigate the possibility of setting up WERN program. Beth has experience of this from previous clubs. She will investigate the possibilities.
3. Prisoner release problems. - we have not yet found a speaker on this , but we had a very good speaker- Ian Radcliffe - who gave us an insight into Community Services sentencing.
4. Children's Sand Digger - This was delivered and installed in December and has been very well received by the Community. We are organizing a plaque stating that the digger was supplied by our Rotary Club. This will be attached to the frame.
5. Assisting the OG Reserve Association with the restoration of the information Centre in the Reserve. This has not progressed as an agreement has still to be reached with the planning authorities.
6. Recycling- we have delivered several bags of bottle tops, pill packets etc for recycling, but this is currently on hold as the receiving centers have stopped accepting goods.
7. Food support for the Uniting Church Loaves and Fishes - we delivered two lots of non-perishable goods to be given to those in need. We donated 32 Packets of Homemade Shortbread for the Christmas Hampers. The recipients of the Shortbread were overcome that someone, a stranger, would Make something for them. Some were in tears. They said the shortbread was delicious.
8. Foreign coins - we delivered just under two Kilos of coins.
9. Blood Donors - Peter Hawthorne has written to other Rotary clubs to try to generate a competition on which club donates most blood. There has been a slow response.
10. Palliative Care - Delia and Marita have both completed training and are currently working with some patients.

Environment

- 1, 100 Trees - the trees are doing well. Andy and the Council have both been out to stake the larger trees. We are organizing another weed killing day in March.
2. The White Mangrove Experience- this is moving forward. We had a good response from the Community at the Market when we presented the brochure from Deakin University students. As a result Jock McKenzie from Earthwatch has asked to be involved.
- 3 - We have delivered a paper to Andrew Harrison of the CCMA to have our plans incorporated into the Rivers of Barwon Action Plan. This plan is going out for public consultation in March. We would ask that all Rotarians look at this plan and give support to our White Mangrove Experience project. If we get enough support our ideas will be included in the final plan!!!

4. We had a meeting with Jeanette Spittle and other council representatives to outline our White Mangrove plan, we have a meeting scheduled with Alison Marchant, the elected member for the Bellarine, and we are in contact with the Bellarine Paddlers Club to offer a joint approach to providing a walkway and a safe launching site at the edge of the Golf Course. We will be applying jointly for a grant through Libby Coker to support a feasibility study and a review of the current flora and fauna in the area affected.

5 . We are continuing to maintain the Lookout Reserve.

Other ideas- could we supply a portable toilet block on our Market Days? Discuss with Adrian.

SOUTH PACIFIC & PHILIPPINES OFFICE: THE ROTARY FOUNDATION TEAM

The Rotary Foundation has responded with specific action in response to the tragedy in Türkiye and Syria. While Rotary and Rotarians are not generally first responders, we do have clubs and members across the devastated areas, and these Rotarians have requested our help. Local clubs and members are best placed to understand the immediate needs of those affected.

In order to provide direct action, the Disaster Response option on www.rotary.org has been replaced with a button that reads Türkiye/Syria Disaster Response Fund. This will stay active on the Rotary website till 31 March 2023. In addition:

- The Trustees immediately made available more than \$125,000 to Rotary districts affected by the earthquake through Disaster Response Grants for immediate disaster response.
- The lead story on Rotary.org and My.Rotary.org about Rotary responding to the earthquake has been updated to include information about helping by giving through the general disaster response fund.
- A video from RIP Jennifer Jones has been shared on social media with a call to action to donate to the Turkey/Syria Disaster Response Fund. The video can be viewed on [Face Book](#), [Twitter](#) and [Instagram](#).
