


<u>Market:</u> Adrian would like some more people to help with gold coin collection at the gates. Please see him if you can help.

Guest Speaker: Anthony Ohlsen.
Anthony has a long history in Rotary and is Chairman of Foundation for the District. The Foundation is entirely Rotary's charity, over which Rotary has complete control of dispersion of funds.

The Foundation was commenced over 100 years ago by Arch Klumpf in America. There has been over 3 billion US dollars spent worldwide with the aim of improving lives, particularly of children and young people, through building amenities for schools for boys and girls, providing clean water, shelter, reading opportunities and equipment, education





Anthony emphasized that it is most important that Rotarians support the Foundation as the projects are sustainable and are conducted according to strict guidelines.

The Slogan, 'Every Rotarian every year' enables members to contribute to Rotary's charity. The methods of giving are: Centurion (\$A100), Paul Harris Fellow (\$US1,000), Paul Harris Society (\$US1,000 annually), Major Donor (\$US10,000 plus), Arch Klumpf Donor (\$US250,000 plus).

Club projects are supported and financed through District Grants, Disaster Relief Grants and Global Grants. Funds distributed in these projects deliver an impact that may not have been otherwise achieved.

District Grants are "matching grants", awarded every year and the hope is that every club will apply for and implement a sustainable and beneficial project in their area using a District Grant

Global Grants are also very worthwhile as two or more clubs are involved, and the amount of funding can be used to 'do good in the world'

Leaves us to wonder where Superman will find a phone booth... See ya later, alligator! Okidoki.




