Guest Speaker: Gary Newton.

Gary contracted polio 70 years ago at 6 months of age. He has

learned to live with the effects of the condition, having undergone many sessions of correctional surgery and extensive physiotherapy. He leads a 'normal' life with a family and a job. Since joining Rotary, he has reason to hope that the Polio Plus campaign along with the matching funds through the Bill Gates Foundation, will eradicate the disease all over the world in the next few years. He is also a great supporter of Polio Plus and a newly formed group the Polio Plus Society that supports polio survivors. This group is particularly important as most survivors in first world countries are entering the age range of



65 years and over. In Australia support through NDIS cuts out for those over 65 years so donations to the Polio Plus Society by individuals are used to provide assistance to people who as they age, late effects take hold and coping mechanisms are no longer sufficient. People who join the society agree to pay at least \$100 per year to increase knowledge and interest in the eradication of the disease so the goal of no new cases will be achieved by 2024.

There are very few members of the society at present and forms were distributed at the meeting for members to consider.

Rotary has been working for 35 years to eradicate polio by joining with WHO and UNICEF to enable workers (mostly volunteers) to move into societies where doubt remains to educate people that the vaccine is safe, and children will not be harmed.

These workers can and have faced danger by people who are afraid of Western medicine.

Currently there are reports of 2 new cases in Pakistan and 5 new cases in Afghanistan.

The main role of Polio Plus is to raise awareness, engagement with the people, raise awareness and fundraising. Children are vaccinated with oral drops and where possible followed up to ensure the disease is eradicated in the area.

The Club donated \$500.00 to Polio Plus at the meeting.

ShelterBox report: 27-9-2023

District 9780 was particularly generous with donations to ShelterBox Australia with \$54,850.00 donated during 2022-23. This was an increase of over 70% in donations. Over 30 Clubs donated during last year in response to Pakistan floods, Turkiye and Syria earthquake and general appeals. Currently ShelterBox is preparing to respond to the Morocco earthquake, a team is travelling to speak with local people, organisations, and our Rotary network to try to understand the scale of shelter needs.

In addition a Libya flooding response assessment is underway. A ShelterBox response team is deploying to neighbouring Tunisia this week to meet with partners, confirming what support is needed and how we will work together. ShelterBox will be working with their trusted partner ACTED to deliver our response. ACTED were already working in Derna before Storm Daniel hit, so they have a strong presence in the region.

I attended the ShelterBox volunteer conference recently and have gained a greater understanding of ShelterBox response and deployment. I am available to speak at Clubs and provide information and flyers.
