### **Annual Rotary Car Raffle**

Almost \$5,000 net. was raised from this project by the efforts of members with particular mention of Geoff Ford who personally sold almost half the tickets.

### **Anzac Day Breakfast.**

The extremely popular "Dawn Service breakfast" organized by John Calnin and assisted by members, necessitated the pulling of strings to obtain further food supplies at 6am.

### **Tree planting**

As part of the Centennial year (100 trees) had been postponed because of lack of rain however, we have scheduled the planting of the first 50 trees below Grants Lookout next week based on the promise of rain! This work in conjunction with Barwon Coast will form the entry points to the popular walking pathway between the surf beach and Smiths beach.

**Blood-a-rine Challenge** organized by Peter Hawthorne continued for the first 6 months and encouraged District Rotarians and friends to become blood donors. Over 2,000 Organ Donor pamphlets were distributed by members in our local communities.

The "Adopt a Highway" project was cancelled due to our inability to provide a safe working environment for participants.

Recent approval for the maintenance of our Grubb Rd... walking track will enable work to commence within the next few weeks. (After 2 years).

Approval of the board walk / walking track along the southern lip of the Bluff will also enable work to commence on this project within weeks.

**It should also be noted that the lead period now required for any project that involves Council is such, that it is unlikely that any project can be proposed, authorised and undertaken within 12 months. That is if approval can be obtained! We need look no further than the 3 consecutive attempts to obtain Council approval for a Centennial Project.**

The attached financial report lists in detail the financial contributions made to various Community causes.

Finally I would thank members of the committee and all Rotarians for the endless support of projects during the year.

## MARKET REPORT

Our 2004 – 2005 Market Season consisted of only seven Markets, with no April Market due to an early Easter. The November Market was seriously affected by rain which meant we had only six 'productive' Markets.

Statistics for the season indicate that for each Market we averaged 811 vehicles with 76 Stall Holders. These figures show a definite and concerning downwards trend from the previous years. If the Market is to continue to be our major fund raising activity, then the challenge is to arrest this downwards trend with continued enthusiasm and new ideas.

The gross takings for the specific season were what I believe under the circumstances, a satisfactory \$14,478.40. This excludes takings from the Cray Spins which amounted to an additional \$950.00.

The Market is very much a Club effort and I would like to thank all those who have been able to support this activity.

Special thanks must be extended to the small but hard working Committee:

- Rod Bush for deputizing for me on various occasions; for his cheerful and encouraging support and also for the excellent computer program he developed to make my work-load much easier.
- Alison George who has organized and managed the Mitre 10 Raffle. Alison has also be a great 'advisor' when it has come to 'vetting' Stall Holder applications and making other decisions of importance.
- Rod Birrell for his tireless and ongoing work with the management signs, witches hats and erection and dismantling of the tent.
- James Turnbull for his development and monitoring of the Roster and also for cheerfully filling in at the seven am shift when Rod Bush and I required assistance.
- Colin Brown, who was not a designated Committee Member but attended our meetings and ensured that the Car Park was always marked ready for use. Mention must also be made of Colin's apprentice Leigh Holloway who supported Colin during the season.

The support and work of all rostered and non-rostered members must be acknowledged. Never during the season did I not get a volunteer when I asked, which was encouraging and greatly appreciated.

## PRESIDENTS REPORT

It is perhaps appropriate to begin this report at the point where the previous President's Report left off: concern over our declining and ageing membership. We have enjoyed remarkable success in recruiting new members this year. Sadly, we have had some losses as well. However, to make those gains count for the future we need to ensure that all of our members, new and old, are retained indefinitely. Given that most new members take some time to learn the ropes, retaining our already productive members should be our highest priority. Every Rotarian has a responsibility in this regard. Membership retention is greatly aided by tolerance and the appreciation of other points of view.

Additionally, we must continue to expand. Rotarians leave for various reasons and in a few cases this is unavoidable. The gaps created by natural attrition need to be filled quickly and smoothly. The skills, knowledge and experience lost to the organization must be replaced and expanded upon. Our organizational health is best maintained and improved by diversification in classification. Therefore, we should continue to identify specific areas of expertise that may be useful to the club. In essence, it is not just numbers that we want, but quality in those numbers. Reflecting on our membership gains this year, I'm confident that we are on the right track. It is important to remember that it is a track, and that we must keep moving along it towards a club membership easily large enough to meet its obligations in sponsoring new clubs.

The setbacks caused by the withdrawal of Council approval for two Centennial Projects previously "approved in principle" are I'm afraid, a normal part of life. It seems that our best course of action remains to have a viable "Plan B" for everything we aim to achieve. So, may we now get some more rain to help the 100 trees grow. May we soon also get approval from Council to see our Memorial Garden grow and may we always strive for the cooperation we need from a growing multitude of agencies and authorities to see all of our community service works continue to grow.

The membership's response to the Tsunami Appeal was magnificent. My thanks go in particular to those collectors who gave up their own time on holidays with family and friends to step quickly into a vital role. Natural disasters remind us too frequently of the fragile state of existence that is the norm for so many people. But, as if Mother Nature wasn't enough to contend with, we face bigger problems.

### Weed Pull

First "hands on" project for the year was a successful weed pull on the foreshore at the Surf Beach in conjunction with Barwon Coast.

### Kingston Park Market

The market continues to be the greatest "consumer" of member's voluntary efforts and also our greatest revenue earner. Tony Haines and his committee have continued the excellent work of previous committees and will detail their success in a separate report.

### Senior Citizens Christmas Dinner

Again, was most successful once again thanks to the organization of John Calnin and the participation of most members.

### Christmas Tree Lighting

### Tsunami Appeal.

We also responded to an initiative from the previous year by sending money for the completion of a Rotary house in Fiji.

### Rotary Foundation

Whilst we are all aware of the wonderful work being funded throughout the world by Rotary Foundation, most of us are not aware that we only raise around \$US1.8 million annually in Australia, yet we spend around \$US3.2 million-leaving a shortfall of approximately \$US1.5 million that has to be funded by other countries.

Members may have to give more serious thought to supporting Foundation in other ways in the future if we wish to continue our Australian programs.

### Other Donations

The club responded to the call to provide goods and a large donation of cash to provide much needed help to victims of the devastating Tsunami which ravaged large areas of South East Asia and Indonesia. This will be covered in detail in the Presidents Report.
